

1. Internal migration


- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 594 thousand persons in April 2018, rising by 11.6 percent (62 thousand persons) from April 2017.
- ☐ The intra-province and inter-province migrants occupied 67.3 percent and 32.7 percent of the total internal migrants in April 2018, respectively.
 - Ompared to April 2017, the intra-province and inter-province migrants grew by 12.8 percent and 9.2 percent, respectively.
- ☐ The internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 14.1 percent, up 1.4%p year-on-year.

2. Internal migration for provinces

- Regarding the net migration for provinces, 7 provinces recorded a plus net migration.: Gyeonggi (12,780 persons), Sejong (3,638 persons), Chungnam (1,166 persons) and so on. On the other hand, 10 provinces recorded a minus net migration.: Seoul (-10,067 persons), Busan (-2,370 persons), Daejeon (-1,746 persons) and so on.
- ☐ Sejong, Jeju and Gyeonggi recorded a plus net migration rate of 15.2 percent, 1.8 percent and 1.2 percent, respectively. On the other hand, Daejeon, Seoul and Ulsan recorded a minus net migration rate of -1.4 percent, -1.3 percent and -1.1 percent, respectively.
