

# **Internal Migration in March 2021**


| $\ \square$ The number of internal migrants was 735 thousand persons in March    |

## 1. Internal migration

- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 735 thousand persons in March 2021, dropping by 4.0% (31 thousand persons) year-on-year.
- ☐ The intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants took up 65.0% and 35.0% of the total internal migrants in March 2021, respectively.
  - O Compared to March 2020, the intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants fell by 5.5% and 1.3%, respectively.

☐ The internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 16.9%, declining by 0.8%p year-on-year.



## 2. Internal migration for metropolitan cities and provinces

- Regarding the net migration of metropolitan cities and provinces, 5 regions recorded a plus net migration.: Gyeonggi (15,135 persons), Gyeongbuk (1,439 persons) and Chungnam (1,190 persons). On the other hand, 12 regions recorded a minus net migration.: Seoul (-6,216 persons), Daegu (-2,877 persons), Ulsan (-2,232 persons) and so on.
- □ Sejong, Gyeonggi and Chungnam recorded a plus net migration rate of 3.2%, 1.3% and 0.7%, respectively. On the other hand, Ulsan, Daegu and Daejeon recorded a minus net migration rate of -2.3%, -1.4% and -1.0%, respectively.
