☐ In the fourth quarter of 2023, the Manufacturing Domestic Supply Index fell by 3.7% from the fourth quarter of 2022, due to the decrease in domestic goods and imported goods.

2. Manufacturing domestic supply by type of goods

- □ In the fourth quarter of 2023, the supply of final goods fell by 4.1% owing to the decrease in consumer goods (-2.0%) and capital goods (-6.5%). <domestic goods (-3.0%) and imported goods (-6.4%)>
 - Oconsumer goods fell by 2.0% from the fourth quarter of 2022 owing to the drop in domestic goods (-1.7%) and imported goods (-2.9%).
 - Capital goods fell by 6.5% from the fourth quarter of 2022 owing to the drop in domestic goods (-4.6%) and imported goods (-10.8%).
- ☐ Intermediate goods decreased by 3.1% owing to the drop in domestic goods (-1.5%) and imported goods (-7.3%).

3. Manufacturing domestic supply by industry

- □ In the fourth quarter of 2023, as for the manufacturing domestic supply by industry, 'Other transport equipment' marked a year-on-year increase. Whereas, 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment', 'Other machinery and equipment' and 'Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers' marked a year-on-year decrease.
 - O'Other transport equipment' grew by 23.7% due to the increase in domestic goods (14.2%) and imported goods (50.6%).
 - 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment' fell by 12.5% due to the decrease in domestic goods (-10.9%) and imported goods (-13.7%).
 - Other machinery and equipment dropped by 10.7% due to the decrease in domestic goods (-8.6%) and imported goods (-15.0%).
 - 'Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers' declined by 3.1% due to the decrease in domestic goods (-2.2%) and imported goods (-7.8%).

4. Share of imported goods

In the fourth quarter of 2023, imported goods accounted for 27.0% of	the
total manufacturing domestic supply (at nominal prices), down 1.6%p fr	om
the fourth quarter of 2022.	

\square (By type of goods)

As for the share of imported goods, final goods and intermediate goods went down by 1.8%p and 1.5%p, respectively.

- As for the share of imported goods, final goods stood at 29.4%, down 1.8%p from the fourth quarter of 2022.
 - As for the share of imported goods, consumer goods occupied 30.6%, down 1.6%p from the fourth quarter of 2022. As for the share of imported goods, capital goods occupied 27.7%, down 2.2%p from the fourth quarter of 2022.
- As for the share of imported goods, intermediate goods stood at 25.4%, down 1.5%p from the fourth quarter of 2022.

\square (By industry)

Compared to the fourth quarter of 2022, 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment', 'Chemicals and chemical products', 'Basic metals' and 'Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers' showed a decrease in the share of imported goods.

- As for the share of imported goods, 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment' stood at 57.7%, down 1.1%p year-on-year.
- As for the share of imported goods, 'Chemicals and chemical products' stood at 33.4%, down 1.5%p year-on-year.
- As for the share of imported goods, 'Basic metals' stood at 23.6%, down 1.4%p year-on-year.
- As for the share of imported goods, 'Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers' stood at 13.9%, down 1.3%p year-on-year.

Manufacturing Domestic Supply Index in 2023

1. Manufacturing domestic supply index

- ☐ In 2023, the Manufacturing Domestic Supply Index went down by 2.4% from 2022, due to the drop in domestic goods and imported goods.
 - Compared to 2022, the supply of domestic goods fell by 2.1% owing to the drop in 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment' and 'Other machinery and equipment'. The supply of imported goods dropped by 3.2% owing to the drop in 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment' and 'Other machinery and equipment'.

\square (By type of goods)

Compared to 2022, final goods declined by 3.4%, owing to the decrease in domestic goods (-3.3%) and imported goods (-3.8%). Intermediate goods declined by 1.6%, owing to the decrease in domestic goods (-1.1%) and imported goods (-2.8%).

- Consumer goods fell by 2.3% from 2022, owing to the drop in domestic goods (-2.5%) and imported goods (-1.6%).
- Capital goods dropped by 5.1% from 2022, owing to the decrease in domestic goods (-4.4%) and imported goods (-6.5%).

\square (By industry)

Compared to 2022, 'Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers' showed an increase in domestic supply. Whereas, 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment' showed a decrease in domestic supply.

- (Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers)

 The supply of 'Motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers' grew by 8.7% owing to the rise in domestic goods (8.7%) and imported goods (8.6%).
- (Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment) The supply of 'Electronic components, computer; visual, sounding and communication equipment' fell by 10.3% owing to the drop in domestic goods (-12.3%) and imported goods (-8.6%).
- Other machinery and equipment)
 The supply of 'Other machinery and equipment' fell by 6.6% owing to the drop in domestic goods (-6.9%) and imported goods (-6.2%).

2. Share of imported goods

- ☐ In 2023, imported goods accounted for 27.8% of the total manufacturing domestic supply (at nominal prices), down 0.9%p from 2022.
 - O (By type of goods)
 As for the share of imported goods, final goods took up 30.7%, down 0.9%p from 2022. As for the share of imported goods, intermediate goods took up 25.9%, down 1.0%p from 2022.
 - As for the share of imported goods, consumer goods accounted for 30.4%, down 0.9%p from 2022. As for the share of imported goods, capital goods accounted for 31.1%, down 0.8%p from 2022.

○ (By industry)

Compared to 2022, 'Chemicals and chemical products' (2.1%p) and 'Medical, precision and optical instruments, watches and clocks' (1.7%p) recorded an increase in the share of imported goods. Whereas, 'Pharmaceuticals, medicinal chemical and botanical products' (-3.2%p) and 'Other non-metallic mineral products' (-2.6%p) recorded a decrease in the share of imported goods.
