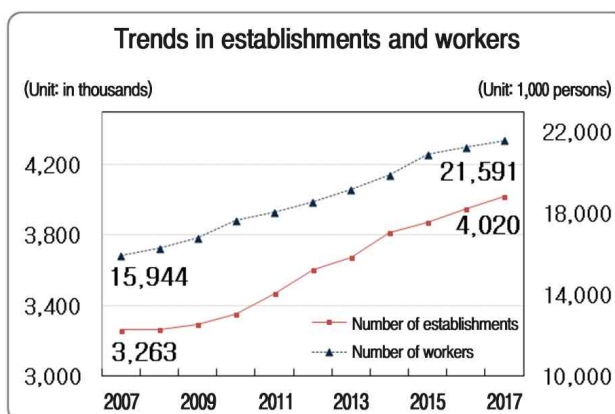
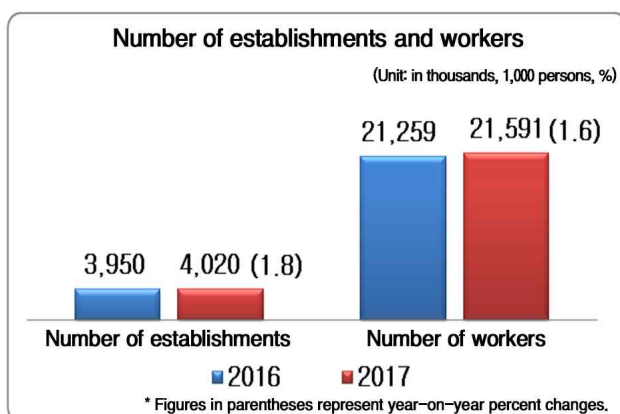


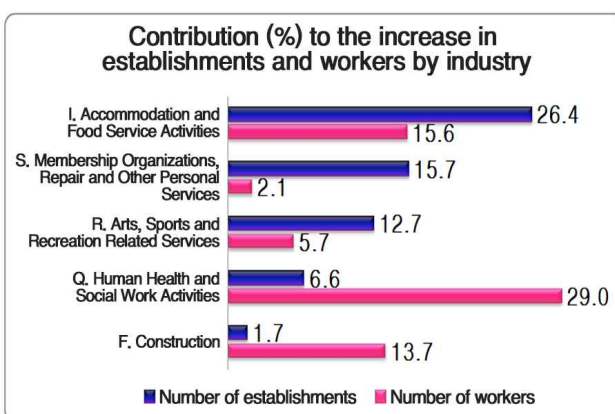
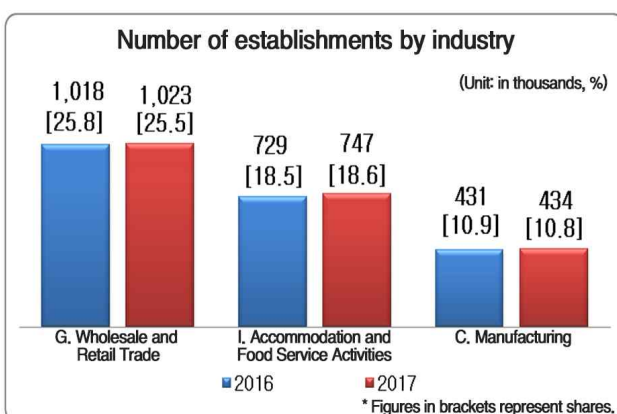
Preliminary Results of 2017 Census on Establishments

1 Number of establishments and workers



- As of the end of 2017, the number of establishments increased by 70 thousand entities (1.8%) to 4,020 thousand entities. The number of workers rose by 332 thousand persons (1.6%) to 21,591 thousand persons.
- Compared to a decade ago, the number of establishments went up by 758 thousand entities (23.2%). The number of workers grew by 5,648 thousand persons (35.4%) from 2007. For the past decade, the number of establishments and workers showed a continuously increasing trend.

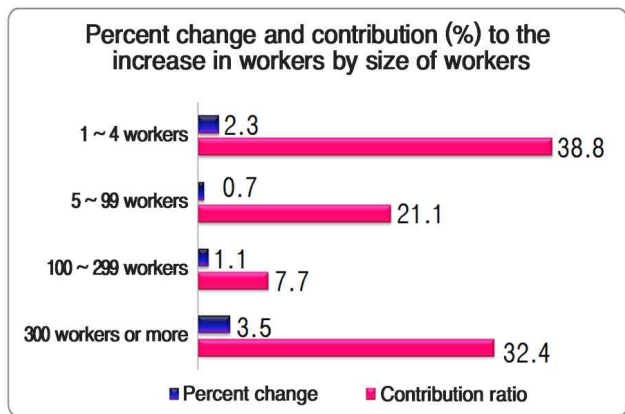
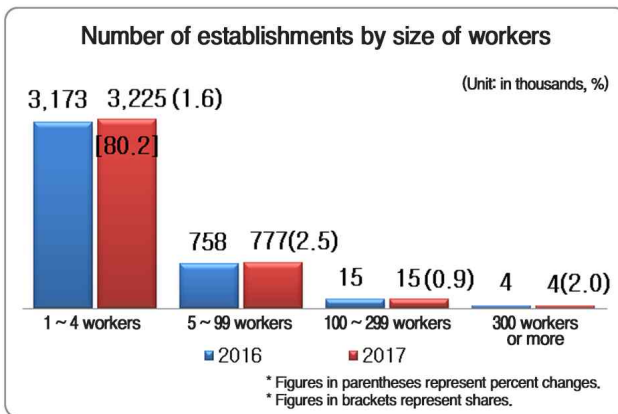
2 Number of establishments and workers by industry



- As for the share of establishments by industry, 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' occupied the largest share at 25.5%, which was followed by 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (18.6%) and 'Manufacturing' (10.8%).

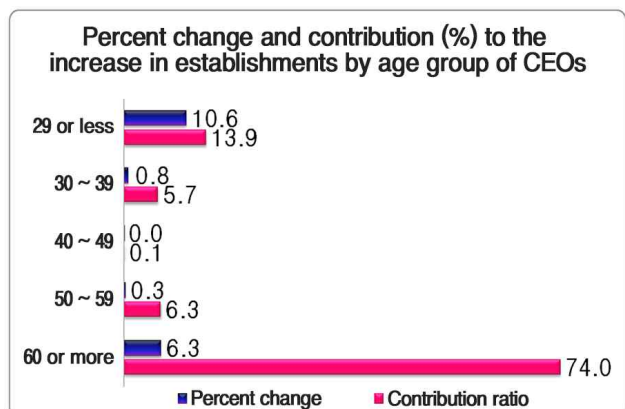
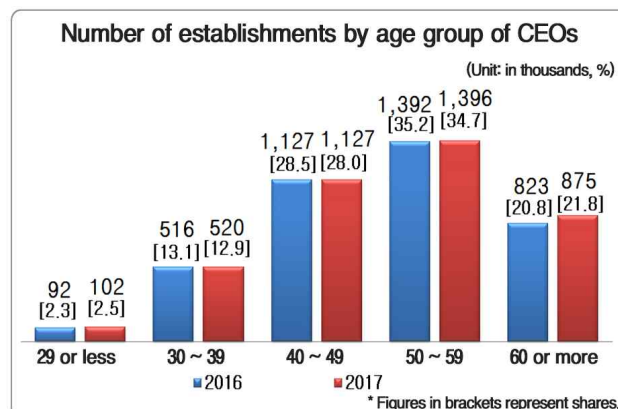
- As for the contribution to the increase in establishments by industry, 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' recorded the highest contribution ratio (26.4%), which was followed by 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' (15.7%) and 'Arts, Sports and Recreation Related Services' (12.7%).
- As for the contribution to the increase in workers by industry, 'Human Health and Social Work Activities' recorded the highest contribution ratio (29.0%), which was followed by 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (15.6%) and 'Construction' (13.7%).

3 Number of establishments and workers by size of workers



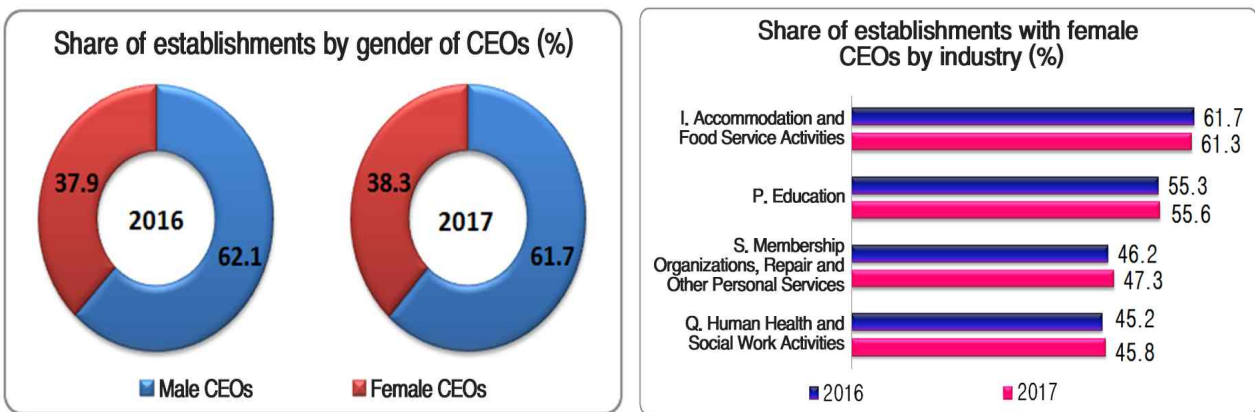
- As for the share of establishments by size of workers, as of the end of 2017, establishments with 1~4 workers showed the highest share at 80.2% (3,225 thousand entities). As for the year-on-year percent change in workers, establishments with 5 ~ 99 workers showed the highest increase at 2.5% (19 thousand entities).
- As for the year-on-year percent change in workers by size of workers, as of the end of 2017, establishments with 300 workers or more showed the highest increase (3.5%) compared to 2016. As for the contribution to the increase in workers by size of workers, establishments with 1 ~ 4 workers showed the highest increase (38.8%) compared to 2016.

4 Number of establishments by age group of CEOs



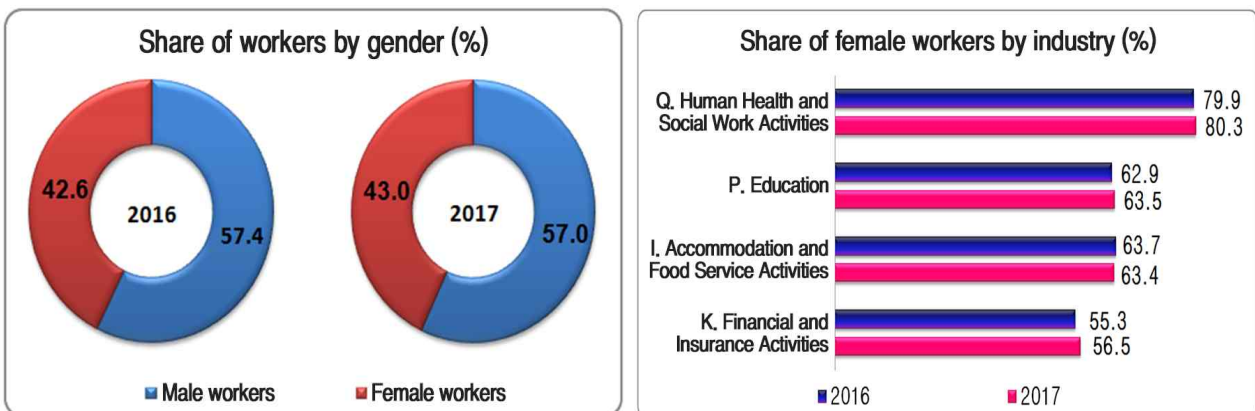
- As of the end of 2017, establishments with CEOs aged 50 ~ 59 occupied the largest share at 34.7% (1,396 thousand entities).
- As for the year-on-year percent change in establishments by age group of CEOs, establishments with CEOs aged 29 or less recorded the highest increase (10.6%) from 2016, which was followed by establishments with CEOs aged 60 or more (6.3%) and establishments with CEOs aged 30 ~ 39 (0.8%).
- As for the contribution to the increase in establishments by age group of CEOs, establishments with CEOs aged 60 or more recorded the highest contribution ratio (74.0%).

5 Number of establishments by gender of CEOs



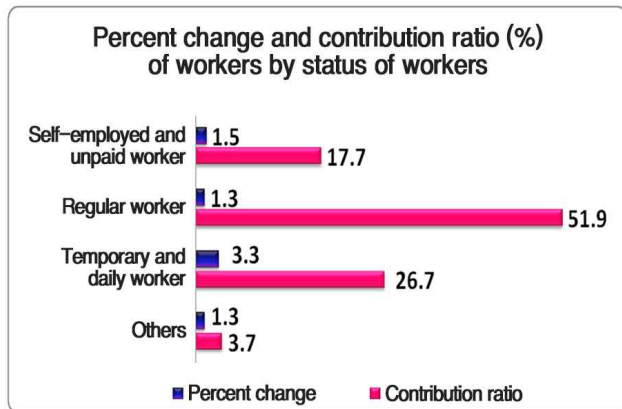
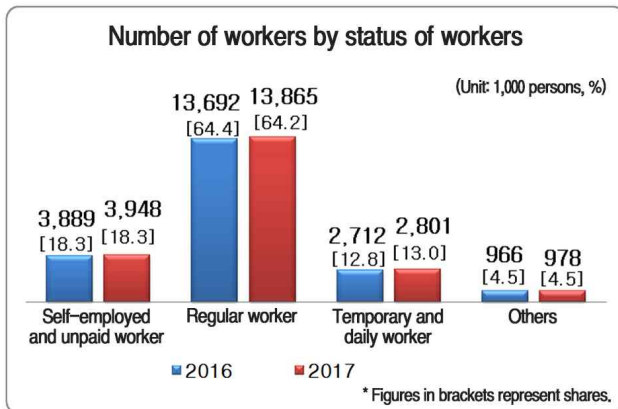
- As of the end of 2017, the share of female CEOs rose to 38.3% from 37.9% in 2016. Whereas, the share of male CEOs dropped to 61.7% from 62.1% in 2016.
- 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' showed the highest share of female CEOs at 61.3%, which was followed by 'Education' (55.6%), 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' (47.3%) and 'Human Health and Social Work Activities' (45.8%).

6 Number of workers by gender



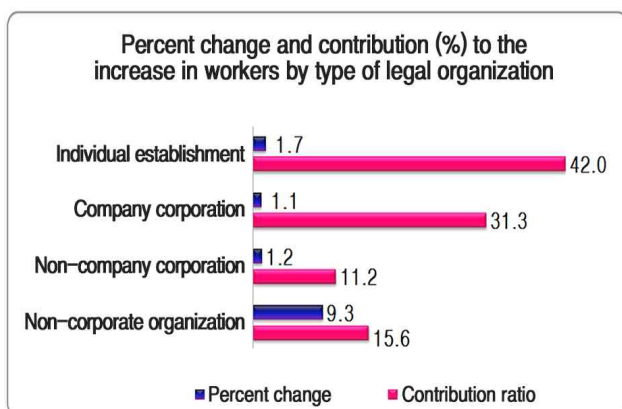
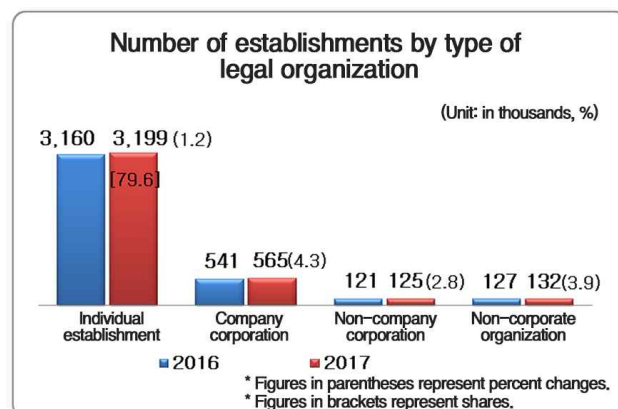
- As of the end of 2017, the share of female workers went up from 42.6% in 2016 to 43.0%. In the meantime, the share of male workers went down from 57.4% in 2016 to 57.0%.
- The share of female workers in 'Human Health and Social Work Activities' showed the highest figure at 80.3%, which was followed by 'Education' (63.5%), 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (63.4%) and 'Financial and Insurance Activities' (56.5%).

7 Number of workers by status of workers



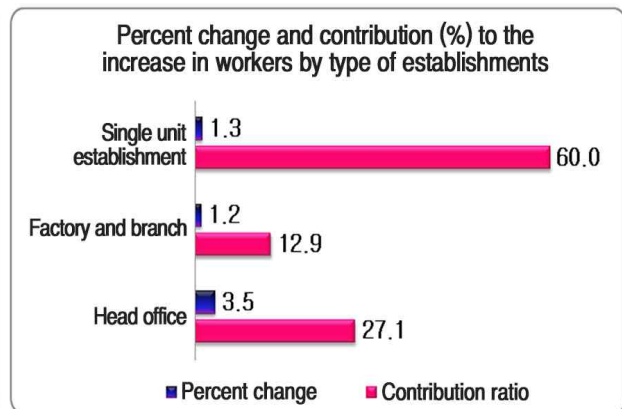
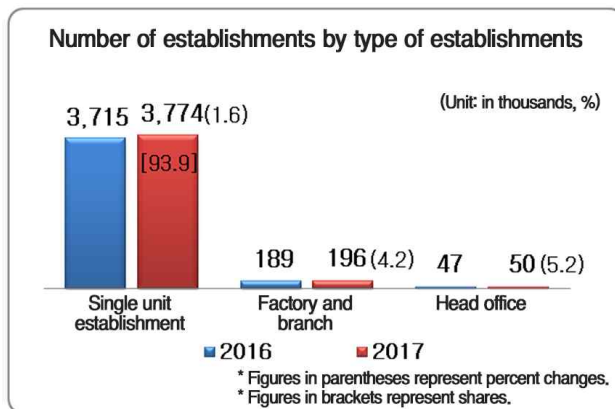
- As for the share of workers by status of workers, 'Regular workers' occupied the largest share at 64.2% (13,865 thousand persons).
- As of the end of 2017, 'Temporary and daily workers' showed the highest year-on-year increase (3.3%), which was followed by 'Self-employed and unpaid family workers' (1.5%), 'Other workers' (1.3%) and 'Regular workers' (1.3%).
- As for the contribution to the increase in workers, 'Regular workers' recorded the highest contribution ratio (51.9%).

8 Number of establishments and workers by type of legal organization



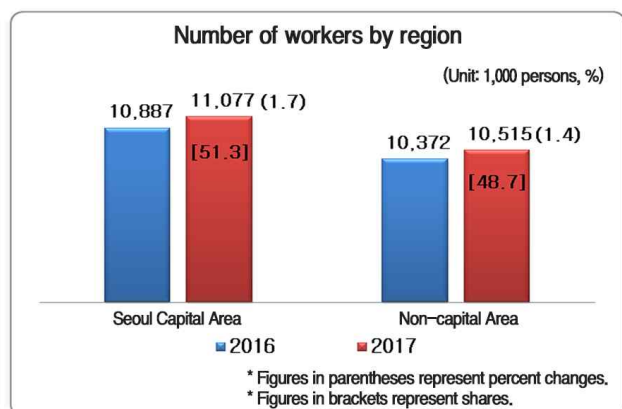
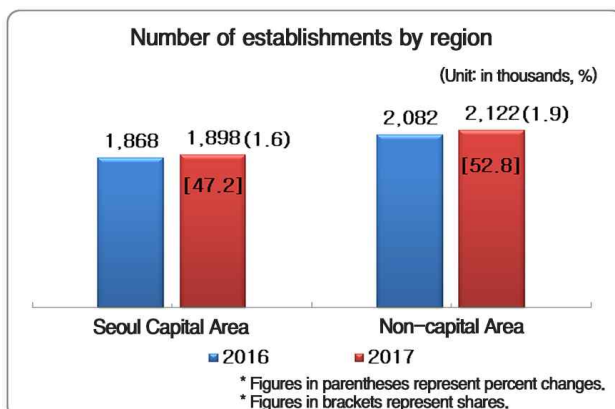
- As for the share of establishments by type of legal organization, as of the end of 2017, individual establishments recorded the highest share at 79.6%. As for the year-on-year percent change in establishments by type of legal organization, company corporations showed the highest increase at 4.3% (23 thousand entities), which was followed by non-corporate organizations (3.9%, 5 thousand entities), non-company corporations (2.8%, 3 thousand entities) and individual establishments (1.2%, 39 thousand entities).
- As for the contribution to the increase in workers, individual establishments recorded the highest contribution ratio (42.0%), which was followed by company corporations (31.3%), non-corporate organizations (15.6%) and non-company corporations (11.2%).

9 Number of establishments and workers by type of establishments



- As for the share of establishments by type of establishments, as of the end of 2017, 'Single unit establishments' recorded the highest share at 93.9% (3,774 thousand entities). As for the year-on-year percent change in establishments, 'Head offices' showed the highest figure at 5.2% (2 thousand entities), which was followed by 'Factories and branches' (4.2%, 8 thousand entities) and 'Single unit establishments' (1.6%, 60 thousand entities).
- As for the contribution to the increase in workers by type of establishments, 'Single unit establishments' marked the highest contribution ratio at 60.0%, which was followed by 'Head offices' (27.1%) and 'Factories and branches' (12.9%).

10 Number of establishments and workers by region



- As for the Seoul Capital Area (Seoul, Incheon and Gyeonggi), the share of establishments stood at 47.2% and the share of workers stood at 51.3%. As for the Non-capital Area, the share of establishments stood at 52.8% and the share of workers stood at 48.7%.
- As for the Seoul Capital Area (Seoul, Incheon and Gyeonggi), the number of establishments increased by 1.6% (30 thousand entities) from 2016, and the number of workers increased by 1.7% (190 thousand persons) from 2016. As for the Non-capital Area, the number of establishments increased by 1.9% (40 thousand entities) from 2016, and the number of workers increased by 1.4% (142 thousand persons) from 2016.
