

Business Demography Statistics in 2019

Active enterprises

In 2019, the number of active enterprises* was 6.527 million, rising by 4.4% from 2018.

- ☐ In 2019, the number of active enterprises* was 6.527 million, rising by 277 thousand (4.4%) from 2018.
 - * Active enterprises refer to enterprises with annual sales or employees in the year among profit enterprises.
- O Among active enterprises, corporate enterprises amounted to 695 thousand in 2019, which increased by 5.8% from 2018. Sole proprietorships amounted to 5.832 million in 2019, which increased by 4.3% from 2018.

- O As for active enterprises by industry, 'Information and Communications' (8.9%), 'Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities' (8.0%) and 'Real Estate Activities' (7.8%) showed a high year-on-year increase.
 - As for the share of active enterprises by industry, 'Real Estate Activities' (22.5%), 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' (22.0%) and 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (13.1%) accounted for 57.6% of the total active enterprises.
- O In 2019, enterprises recording annual sales of 'Less than 50 million won' marked 3.25 million, which accounted for 49.8% of the total active enterprises.

O Active enterprises with female CEOs amounted to 2.542 million, which accounted for 38.9% of the total active enterprises. This share showed a gradually expanding trend.

- O As for active enterprises by age group of CEOs, enterprises whose CEOs were '60 or more' increased by 11.7%, while enterprises whose CEOs were '30 ~ 39' decreased by 0.2%.
 - As for the share of active enterprises by age group of CEOs, enterprises whose CEOs were '50 ~ 59' showed the highest figure at 31.6%, which was followed by enterprises whose CEOs were '60 or more' (26.1%).

Birth enterprises

In 2019, the number of birth enterprises was 997 thousand, rising by 8.4% from 2018.

- ☐ In 2019, the number of birth enterprises was 997 thousand, rising by 77 thousand (8.4%) from 2018.
 - In 2019, the birth rate of enterprises stood at 15.3%, up 0.6%p from 2018.
- O Among birth enterprises, corporate enterprises marked 76 thousand in 2019, rising by 10.3% from 2018. Sole proprietorships marked 920 thousand in 2019, rising by 8.2% from 2018.
 - Corporate enterprises and sole proprietorships recorded 7.7% and 92.3% of the total birth enterprises, respectively.

- O As for birth enterprises by industry, 'Transportation and Storage' (29.2%), 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' (13.7%) and 'Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities' (13.0%) showed a high year-on-year increase rate.
 - The birth enterprises of 'Real Estate Activities' (25.3%), 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' (20.3%) and 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (16.7%) took up 62.3% of the total birth enterprises.

- One-person birth enterprises amounted to 893 thousand, which increased by 8.8% from 2018. This figure occupied 89.6% of the total birth enterprises.
- O The birth enterprises showed a year-on-year increase in all age groups of CEOs including CEOs of '60 or more' (27.4%).
 - As for the share of birth enterprises by age group of CEOs, enterprises whose CEOs were '40 ~ 49' showed the highest figure at 27.7%, which was followed by enterprises whose CEOs were '50 ~ 59' (25.7%).

Death enterprises

In 2018, the number of death enterprises was 692 thousand, falling by 0.9% from 2017.

- ☐ In 2018, the number of death enterprises* was 692 thousand, dropping by 6 thousand (-0.9%) from 2017.
 - In 2018, the death rate of enterprises stood at 11.1%, down 0.4%p from 2017.
 - * Enterprises that were active in the year (x) and were not active in the following year of the year (x+1) were counted as death enterprises for the year (x).
- O Among death enterprises, corporate enterprises marked 45 thousand in 2018, rising by 8.5% from 2017. Sole proprietorships marked 647 thousand in 2018, dropping by 1.5% from 2017.
- Corporate enterprises and sole proprietorships recorded 6.6% and 93.4% of the total death enterprises, respectively.

- O As for death enterprises by industry, 'Transportation and Storage' (-13.0%), 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' (-8.0%) and 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (-4.8%) recorded a high year-on-year decrease rate.
- The death enterprises of 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' (25.3%), 'Real Estate Activities' (20.5%), and 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (20.0%) took up 65.8% of the total death enterprises.
- One-person death enterprises amounted to 634 thousand, which decreased by 1.6% from 2017. This figure occupied 91.6% of the total death enterprises.
- O The death enterprises showed a year-on-year decrease in all age groups of CEOs excluding CEOs of '29 or less' (4.8%).

- As for the share of death enterprises by age group of CEOs, enterprises whose CEOs were '50 \sim 59' showed the highest figure at 27.2%, which was followed by enterprises whose CEOs were '40 \sim 49' (27.1%).

Survival rates*

In 2018, the 1-year survival rate of enterprises born in 2017 stood at 63.7%, falling by 1.3%p from 2017.

- □ Among active enterprises in 2018, the 1-year survival rate of enterprises born in 2017 and still alive in 2018 stood at 63.7%, down 1.3%p compared to 2017. Among active enterprises in 2018, the 5-year survival rate of enterprises born in 2013 and still alive in 2018 stood at 31.2%, up 1.9%p compared to 2017.
 - * The survival rate of birth enterprises indicates the percentage of sustained enterprises as of the 'reference year' after the birth of enterprises 1 year 5 years ago.
- O In 2018, the 1-year survival rate of corporate enterprises stood at 72.1%, down 0.6%p from 2017. In 2018, the 5-year survival rate of corporate enterprises stood at 39.9%, down 0.4%p from 2017.
- O In 2018, the 1-year survival rate of sole proprietorships stood at 63.1%, down 1.2%p from 2017. In 2018, the 5-year survival rate of sole proprietorships stood at 30.4%, up 2.0%p from 2017.


O As for 1-year and 5-year survival rates by industry, 'Electricity, Gas, Steam and Air Conditioning Supply' (1-year survival rate: 90.6%, 5-year survival rate: 79.3%) recorded the highest figure. Whereas, 'Financial and Insurance Activities' (1-year survival rate: 51.9%, 5-year survival rate: 17.6%) recorded the lowest figure.

High-growth enterprises and gazelles

In 2019, the number of high-growth enterprises was 4,449, dropping by 3.3% from 2018. In 2019, the number of gazelles was 1,246, rising by 7.5% from 2018.

- ☐ In 2019, the number of high-growth enterprises was 4,449, which decreased by 151 (3.3%) from 2018.
 - * High-growth enterprises refer to enterprises with average annualised growth greater than 20% per annum, over the 3-year period, in terms of annual sales and regular workers.
 - O As for high-growth enterprises by industry, 'Manufacturing' (134 enterprises) and 'Business Facilities Management and Business Support Services' (78 enterprises) showed a year-on-year decrease. Whereas, 'Information and Communications' (57 enterprises) showed a year-on-year increase.
 - 'Manufacturing' showed the highest share of high-growth enterprises at 27.9%, which was followed by 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' (15.6%) and 'Construction' (11.1%).
- ☐ In 2019, the number of gazelles was 1,246, which increased by 87 (7.5%) from 2018.
 - * Gazelles refer to high-growth enterprises with business registration for 5 years or less.
- O As for gazelles by industry, 'Human Health and Social Work Activities' (26 enterprises) and 'Construction' (19 enterprises) showed a year-on-year increase. Whereas, 'Business Facilities Management and Business Support Services' (20 enterprises) showed a year-on-year decrease.

- 'Manufacturing' recorded the highest share of gazelles at 27.0%, which was followed by 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' (17.1%) and 'Information and Communications' (11.6%).
