

## Supplementary Results of the Local Area Labour Force Survey in the First Half of 2021 (Married Women)

## [ Employed women ]


The number of married employed women aged 15~54 who lived with children aged 17 or less was 2.606 million persons, which declined by 66 thousand persons year-on-year.

- As for married employed women aged 15~54 by age group, those aged 40~49 recorded the highest figure of 1.465 million persons (56.2%). This figure was followed by those aged 30~39 (896 thousand persons, 34.4%), those aged 50~54 (187 thousand persons, 7.2%) and those aged 15~29 (58 thousand persons, 2.2%).
- As for married employed women aged 15~54 by educational attainment, 'College graduates or more' totaled the highest figure of 1.73 million persons (66.4%). This figure was followed by 'High school graduates' (814 thousand persons, 31.2%) and 'Middle school graduates or less' (63 thousand persons, 2.4%).


The employment-to-population ratio of married employed women aged 15~54 who lived with children aged 17 or less stood at 56.2%, rising by 0.7%p year-on-year.

- As for the employment-to-population ratio by the number of children, the employment-to-population ratio of employed women with 1 child stood at 58.1%, up 1.0%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with 3 children stood at 52.5%, up 1.5%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with 2 children stood at 54.8%, remaining the same year-on-year.
- As for the employment-to-population ratio by age group of children, the employment-to-population ratio of employed women with the youngest child aged 7~12 stood at 59.0%, up 0.5%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with the youngest child aged 13~17 stood at 66.1%, up 0.8%p year-on-year. In the meantime, the employment-to-population ratio of employed women with the youngest child aged 6 or less stood at 47.5%, remaining the same year-on-year.

The average employment hours of employed women living with children aged 17 or less marked 36.0 hours per week, rising by 3.6 hours year-on-year.

As for the average employment hours by age group of children, the average employment hours of employed women with the youngest child aged 6 or less recorded 33.5 hours, rising by 3.6 hours year-on-year. The average employment hours of employed women with the youngest child aged 7~12 recorded 36.8 hours, rising by 3.5 hours year-on-year. The average employment hours of employed women with the youngest child aged 13~17 recorded 37.9 hours, rising by 3.3 hours year-on-year.

## [ Career interrupted women ]

Among married women aged 15~54, career interrupted women amounted to 1.448 million persons, falling by 57 thousand persons year-on-year.

- Among married women aged 15~54 (8.323 million persons), the unemployed and economically inactive women totaled 3.24 million persons. In particular, career interrupted women amounted to 1.448 million persons.
  - Among married women aged 15~54, career interrupted women occupied 17.4%, down 0.2%p year-on-year.
- As for career interrupted women by age group, women aged 30~39 recorded the highest figure of 655 thousand persons (45.2%). This figure was followed by those aged 40~49 (579 thousand persons, 40.0%), those aged 50~54 (138 thousand persons, 9.6%) and those aged 15~29 (75 thousand persons, 5.2%).

The largest share of career interrupted women quit their job due to 'Child care' (43.2%).

The largest share of career interrupted women quit their job due to 'Child care' (43.2%). This figure was followed by 'Marriage' (27.4%), 'Pregnancy & child birth' (22.1%), 'Child education' (3.8%) and 'Family care' (3.4%).

As for reasons for career interruption of career interrupted women aged 30~39, which occupied the largest share of the total career interrupted women, 'Child care' (47.6%) occupied the highest share. This figure was followed by 'Pregnancy & child birth' (25.4%) and 'Marriage' (24.1%).

The number of career interrupted women who lived with children aged 17 or less was 1.184 million persons, which dropped by 58 thousand persons year-on-year.

- Among married women aged 15~54 who lived with children 17 or less, the share of career interrupted women stood at 25.5%. The more children, the higher share of career interrupted women. The younger children, the higher share of career interrupted women.
  - As the share of career interrupted women by the number of children, career interrupted women with 3 children or more showed the highest figure at 29.8%, which was followed by those with 2 children (27.5%) and those with 1 child (22.8%).
  - As the share of career interrupted women by age of children, career interrupted women with children aged 6 or less showed the highest figure at 37.5%, which was followed by those with children aged 7~12 (21.6%) and those with children aged 13~17 (11.5%).
