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Characteristics of the Employed Persons by Industry and Occupation according to the Local Area Labour Force Survey in the Second Half of 2022

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1. Characteristics of the employed persons by industry

Characteristics of the employed persons by industry group

- In the second half of 2022, as for employed persons by industry group, 'Restaurants and mobile food service activities' showed the highest figure of 1.607 million persons (5.7% of the total employed persons), which was followed by 'Growing of crops' (1.448 million persons, 5.1%) and 'Non-residential welfare facilities' (1.408 million persons, 5.0%).
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by industry group, 'Drinking places and non-alcoholic beverages places' showed the highest increase of 71 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Growing of crops' (53 thousand persons).
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by industry group, 'Activities of employment placement agencies and provision of human resources' showed the highest decrease of 23 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Wholesale of machinery, equipment and supplies' (22 thousand persons).
- As for employed males by industry group, 'Growing of crops' marked the highest figure, which was followed by 'Restaurants and mobile food service activities'. As for employed females by industry group, 'Non-residential welfare facilities' marked the highest figure, which was followed by 'Restaurants and mobile food service activities'.
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed males by industry group, 'Restaurants and mobile food service activities' grew by 40 thousand persons. Whereas, 'Wholesale of machinery, equipment and supplies' fell by 19 thousand persons.
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed females by industry group, 'Medical and dental practice activities' grew by 44 thousand persons. Whereas, 'Activities of employment placement agencies and provision of human resources' fell by 19 thousand persons.

Characteristics of the employed persons by industry division

- As for employed persons by industry division, 'Food and beverage service activities' marked the highest figure of 2.085 million persons (7.3% of the total employed persons), which was followed by 'Retail trade, except motor vehicles and motorcycles' (2.037 million persons, 7.2%) and 'Education' (1.914 million persons, 6.7%).

- As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by industry division, 'Food and beverage service activities' showed the highest increase of 114 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Human health activities' (72 thousand persons).
- As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by industry division, 'Retail trade, except motor vehicles and motorcycles' showed the highest decrease of 35 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Business support services' (32 thousand persons).

Characteristics of the employed persons by industry section

- As for wage workers by industry section, 'Manufacturing' showed the highest share at 18.8%. As for non-wage workers by industry section, 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' showed the highest share at 22.8%.
 - Among wage workers, regular workers showed the highest share in 'Manufacturing' (23.4%). Temporary and daily workers showed the highest share in 'Human health and social work activities' (14.8%).

2. Characteristics of the employed persons by occupation

Characteristics of the employed persons by occupation group

- As for employed persons by occupation group, 'Business administration and office clerks' recorded the highest figure of 2.328 million persons (8.2% of the total employed persons), which was followed by 'Store sales workers' (1.639 million persons, 5.8%) and 'Crop growers' (1.373 million persons, 4.8%).
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by occupation group, 'Administrative clerks' marked the highest increase of 81 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Cooks' (72 thousand persons).
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by occupation group, 'Store sales workers' marked the highest decrease of 47 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Secretaries and administrative assistants' (36 thousand persons).
- As for employed males by occupation group, 'Business administration and office clerks' recorded the highest figure, which was followed by 'Automobile drivers'. As for employed females by occupation group, 'Store sales workers' recorded the highest figure, which was followed by 'Business administration and office clerks'.
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed males by occupation group, 'Food and beverage service workers' marked the highest increase of 44 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Store sales workers' (63 thousand persons).
 - As for the year-on-year change in employed females by occupation group, 'Administrative clerks' marked the highest increase of 69 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Secretaries and administrative assistants' (24 thousand persons).

□ Characteristics of the employed persons by occupational division

- As for employed persons by occupation division, 'Administration and accounting-related occupations' recorded the highest figure of 4.064 million persons (14.3% of the total employed persons). This figure was followed by 'Cooking and food service occupations' (1.687 million persons, 5.9%) and 'Store sales and rental sales occupations' (1.674 million persons, 5.9%).
- As for the year-on-year change in employed persons by occupation group, 'Cooking and food service occupations' showed the highest increase of 133 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Administration and accounting-related occupations' (96 thousand persons).
- In the meantime, 'Store sales and rental sales occupations' showed the highest decrease of 45 thousand persons, which was followed by 'Driving and transport-related occupations' (40 thousand persons).

□ Characteristics of wage workers by wage level

- As for the share of wage workers by wage level, workers earning '2 million won ~ less than 3 million won' occupied the largest share at 33.8%, which was followed by those earning '4 million won or more' (22.1%), those earning '3 million won ~ less than 4 million won' (20.8%), those earning '1 million won ~ less than 2 million won' (14.2%) and those earning 'less than 1 million won' (9.1%).
- Compared to the second half of 2021, the share of wage workers earning '4 million won or more' and '3 million won ~ less than 4 million won' went up by 2.9%p and 2.7%p, respectively. Whereas, the share of wage workers earning '1 million won ~ less than 2 million won', 'less than 1 million won' and '2 million won ~ less than 3 million won' went down by 4.4%p, 0.9%p and 0.3%p, respectively.
