



# Supplementary Results of the Local Area Labour Force Survey in the First Half of 2022 (Married Women's Employment Status)

## 【 Employed women living with children 】

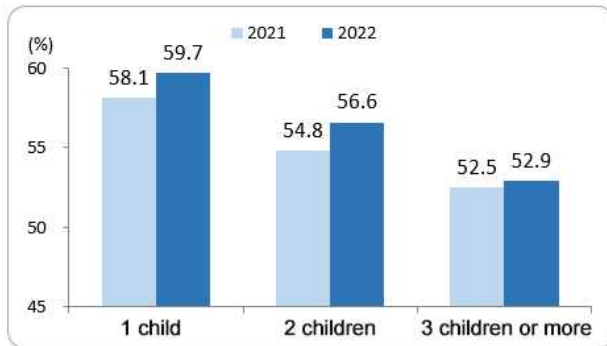
**The number of married employed women aged 15~54 who lived with children aged 17 or less was 2.622 million persons in the first half of 2022, which rose by 16 thousand persons year-on-year.**

- As for married employed women aged 15~54 by age group, those aged 40~49 recorded the highest figure of 1.509 million persons (57.6%). This figure was followed by those aged 30~39 (850 thousand persons, 32.4%), those aged 50~54 (210 thousand persons, 8.0%) and those aged 15~29 (52 thousand persons, 2.0%).
- As for married employed women aged 15~54 by educational attainment, 'College graduates or more' totaled the highest figure of 1.778 million persons (67.8%). This figure was followed by 'High school graduates' (783 thousand persons, 29.9%) and 'Middle school graduates or less' (61 thousand persons, 2.3%).

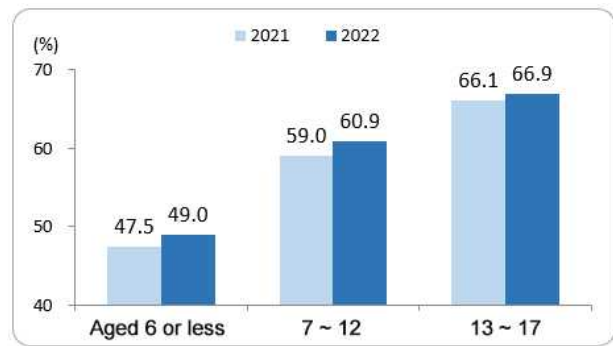
**The employment-to-population ratio of married employed women aged 15~54 who lived with children aged 17 or less stood at 57.8%, rising by 1.6%p year-on-year.**

- As for the employment-to-population ratio by the number of children, the employment-to-population ratio of employed women with 1 child stood at 59.7%, up 1.6%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with 2 children stood at 56.6%, up 1.8%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with 3 children stood at 52.9%, up 0.4%p year-on-year.
- z employment-to-population ratio of employed women with the youngest child aged 6 or less stood at 49.0%, up 1.5%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with the youngest child aged 7~12 stood at 60.9%, up 1.9%p year-on-year. The employment-to-population ratio of employed women with the youngest child aged 13~17 stood at 66.9%, up 0.8%p year-on-year.

**The average employment hours of employed women living with children aged 17 or less marked 35.6 hours per week, falling by 0.4 hour year-on-year.**

- As for the average employment hours by age group of children, the average employment hours of employed women with the youngest child aged 6 or less recorded 33.4 hours, falling by 0.1 hour year-on-year. The average employment hours of employed women with the youngest child aged 7~12 recorded 36.2 hours, falling by 0.6 hour year-on-year. The average employment hours of employed women with the youngest child aged 13~17 recorded 37.4 hours, falling by 0.5 hour year-on-year.

## 【 Career interrupted women 】

**Among married women aged 15~54, career interrupted women amounted to 1.397 million persons, falling by 51 thousand persons year-on-year.**

- Among married women aged 15~54 (8.103 million persons), the unemployed and economically inactive women totaled 3.027 million persons. In particular, career interrupted women amounted to 1.397 million persons.
  - Among married women aged 15~54, career interrupted women occupied 17.2%, down 0.2%p year-on-year.
- As for career interrupted women by age group, women aged 30~39 recorded the highest figure of 600 thousand persons (43.0%). This figure was followed by those aged 40~49 (588 thousand persons, 42.1%), those aged 50~54 (152 thousand persons, 10.9%) and those aged 15~29 (57 thousand persons, 4.1%).

**The largest share of career interrupted women quit their job due to 'Child care' (42.8%).**

- The largest share of career interrupted women quit their job due to 'Child care' (42.8%). This figure was followed by 'Marriage' (26.3%), 'Pregnancy & child birth' (22.7%), 'Family care' (4.6%) and 'Child education' (3.6%).

- As for reasons for career interruption of career interrupted women aged 30~39, which occupied the largest share of the total career interrupted women, 'Child care' (47.4%) occupied the highest share. This figure was followed by 'Pregnancy & child birth' (26.3%) and 'Marriage' (24.0%).

**The number of career interrupted women who lived with children aged 17 or less was 1.146 million persons, which dropped by 38 thousand persons year-on-year.**

- Among married women aged 15~54 who lived with children 17 or less, the share of career interrupted women stood at 25.3%. The more children, the higher share of career interrupted women. The younger children, the higher share of career interrupted women.
  - As the share of career interrupted women by the number of children, career interrupted women with 3 children or more showed the highest figure at 30.0%, which was followed by those with 2 children (27.5%) and those with 1 child (22.4%).
  - As the share of career interrupted women by age of children, career interrupted women with children aged 6 or less showed the highest figure at 37.0%, which was followed by those with children aged 7~12 (22.0%) and those with children aged 13~17 (12.0%).
