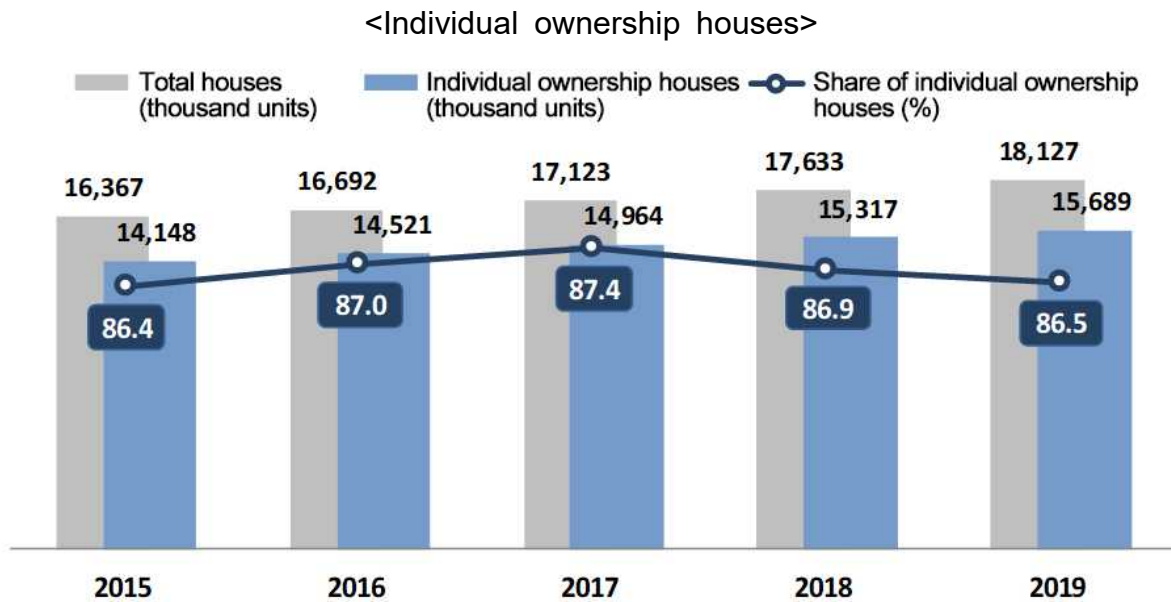




2019 Statistics of House Ownership

1. Individual ownership houses

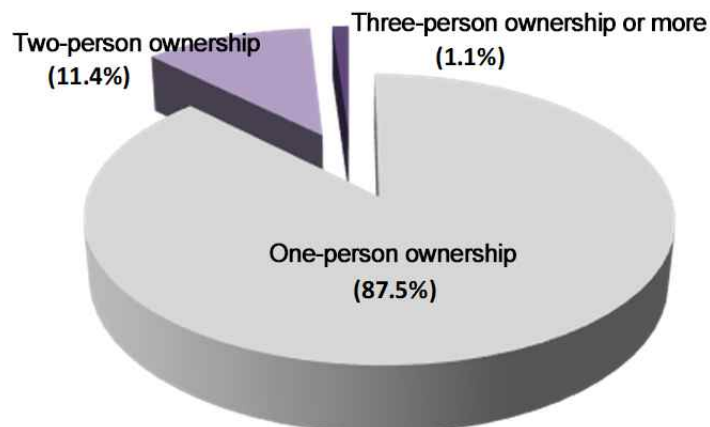
- In 2019, the individual ownership houses marked 15.689 million units, which occupied 86.5% of the total houses (18.127 million units). This share went down by 0.4%p from 86.9% in 2018.
- The individual ownership houses increased by 371 thousand units (2.4%) compared to 2018.



- The one-person ownership houses and the co-ownership houses accounted for 87.5% and 12.5%, respectively. The share of co-ownership houses showed an ever-increasing trend.

* Share of co-ownership houses: 11.0% (2016) → 11.7% (2017) → 12.2% (2018) → 12.5% (2019)

<One-person ownership and co-ownership houses>

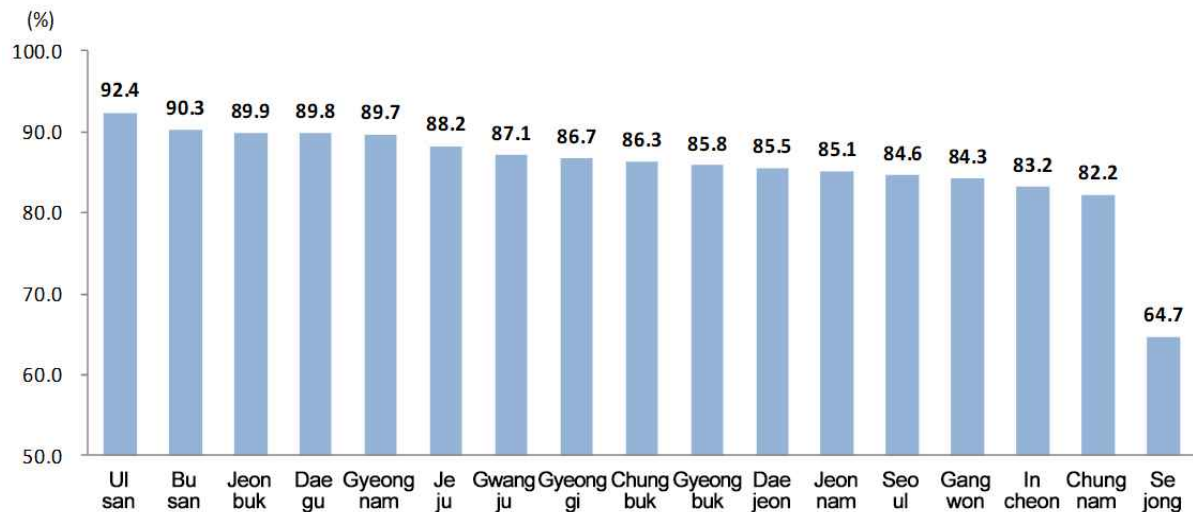


□ The share of individual owners who resided in the same region as the location of ownership houses stood at 86.5% for metropolitan cities and provinces and 75.8% for Si, Gun and Gu regions.

* Share of individual owners residing in the same region as the location of ownership houses in metropolitan cities and provinces: 86.7% (2016) → 86.5% (2017) → 86.5% (2018) → 86.5% (2019)

2. House ownership individuals

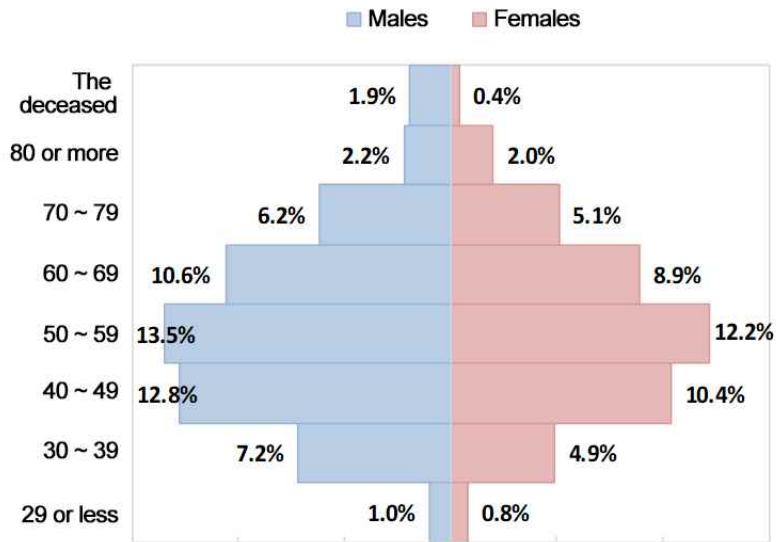
□ The house ownership individuals amounted to 14.336 million persons in 2019, which rose by 325 thousand persons (2.3%) from 2018.

○ As for house ownership by sex, house ownership males amounted to 7.922 million persons, which accounted for 55.3% of the total house owners. The house ownership females amounted to 6.414 million persons, which accounted for 44.7% of the total house owners. The percentage of house ownership females showed an ever-increasing trend.

* Share of house ownership females: 43.6% (2016) → 43.9% (2017) → 44.4% (2018) → 44.7% (2019)

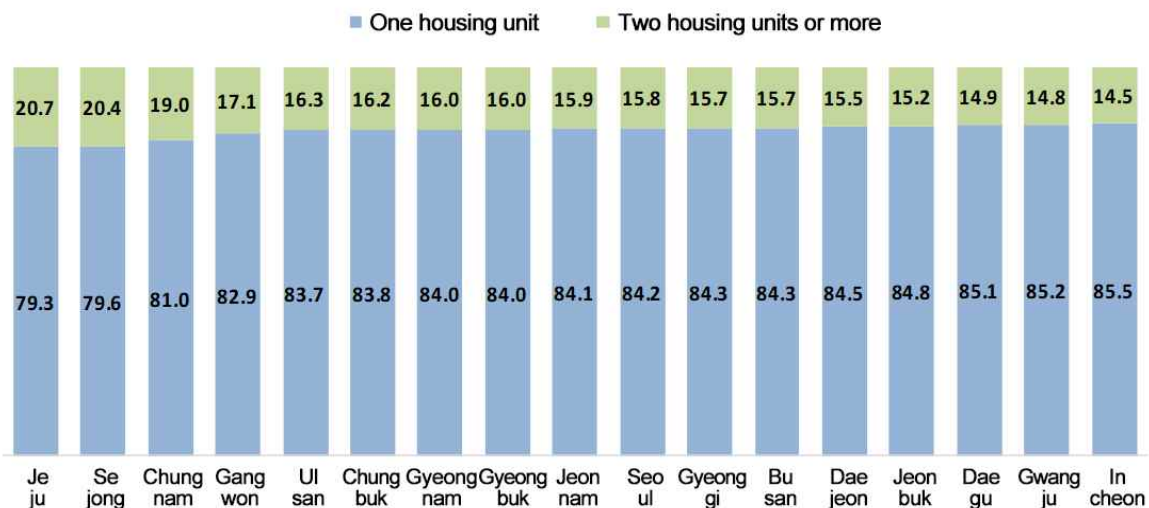
○ As for house ownership by age group, house owners aged 50 ~ 59 occupied the largest share at 25.7%, which was followed by those aged 40 ~ 49 (23.1%), those aged 60 ~ 69 (19.5%), those aged 30 ~ 39 (12.1%) and those aged 70 ~ 79 (11.2%).

- 14.336 million house ownership individuals owned 15.689 million housing units. Their average number of houses recorded 1.09 units per owner, which remained the same as 2018.
- The individuals owning one housing unit recorded 12.052 million persons, which occupied 84.1% of the total house owners. The individuals owning two housing units or more recorded 2.284 million persons, which occupied 15.9% of the total house owners. The share of individuals owning 2 housing units or more showed an ever-increasing trend.
- * Share of individuals owning two housing units or more: 13.6% (2012) → 13.7% (2013) → 13.6% (2014) → 14.4% (2015) → 14.9% (2016) → 15.5% (2017) → 15.6% (2018) → 15.9% (2019)
- Jeju (20.7%) showed the highest share of individuals owning 2 housing units or more, which was followed by Sejong (20.4%) and Chungnam (19.0%). Incheon (14.5%) showed the lowest share of individuals owning 2 housing units or more, which was followed by Gwangju (14.8%) and Daegu (14.9%).

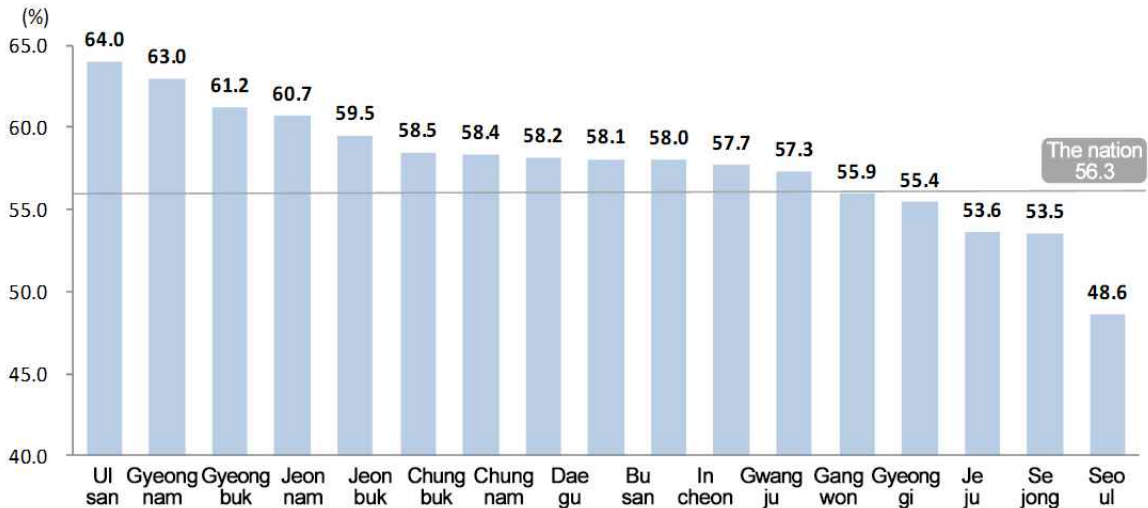
<Share of house ownership individuals by residence region and the number of ownership houses (%)>



3. House ownership households

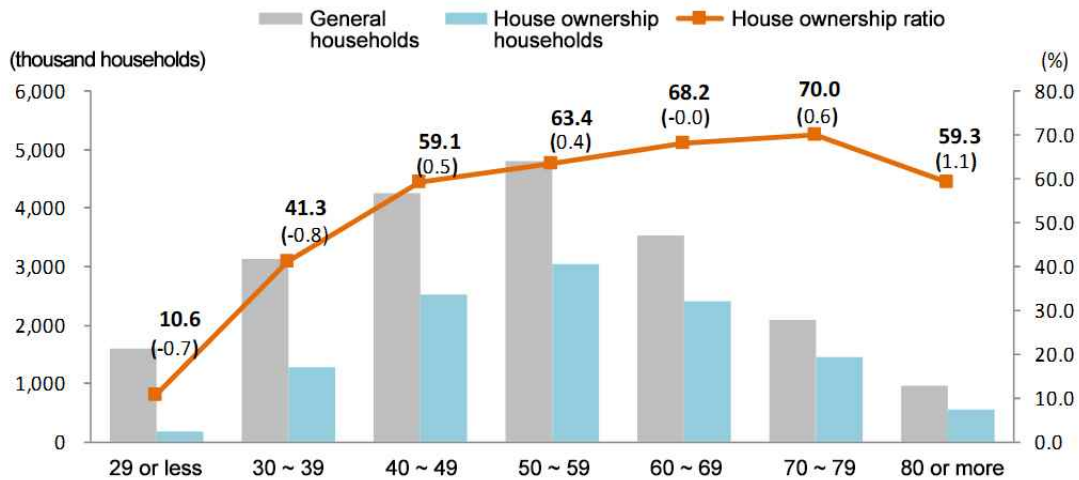
- Among general households (20.343 million households), the house ownership households amounted to 11.456 million households (56.3%), rising by 2.0% from 2018. The non-ownership households amounted to 8.887 million households, rising by 1.6% from 2018.
- The households owning one housing unit totaled 8.288 million households, which accounted for 72.3% of the total house ownership households. The households owning 2 housing units or more totaled 3.168 million households, which accounted for 27.7% of the total house ownership households.
- As for house ownership households, their average number of houses recorded 1.37 units per household. The average house asset value recorded 275 million won. The average housing area recorded 86.4m² per housing unit. The average age of household heads recorded 55.8 years. The average household size marked 2.74 persons.
- The house ownership ratio of general households stood at 56.3%, up 0.1%p from 2018.
- Ulsan (64.0%) showed the highest house ownership ratio, which was followed by Gyeongnam (63.0%) and Gyeongbuk (61.2%). Whereas, Seoul (48.6%) showed the lowest house ownership ratio, which was followed by Sejong (53.5%) and Daejeon (53.6%).

<House ownership ratio of households by residence region>

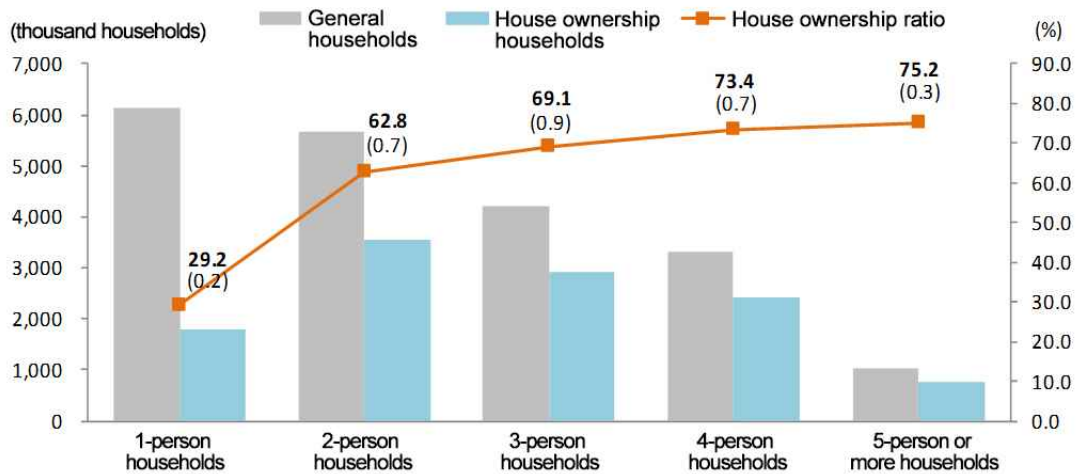


- As for the house ownership ratio by age of household head, household heads aged 70 ~ 79 marked the highest ratio at 70.0%. As for the house ownership ratio by household size, 5-person or more households marked the highest ratio at 75.2%. As for the house ownership ratio by household composition, three-generation or more households marked the highest ratio at 79.6%.

<House ownership ratio by household size>

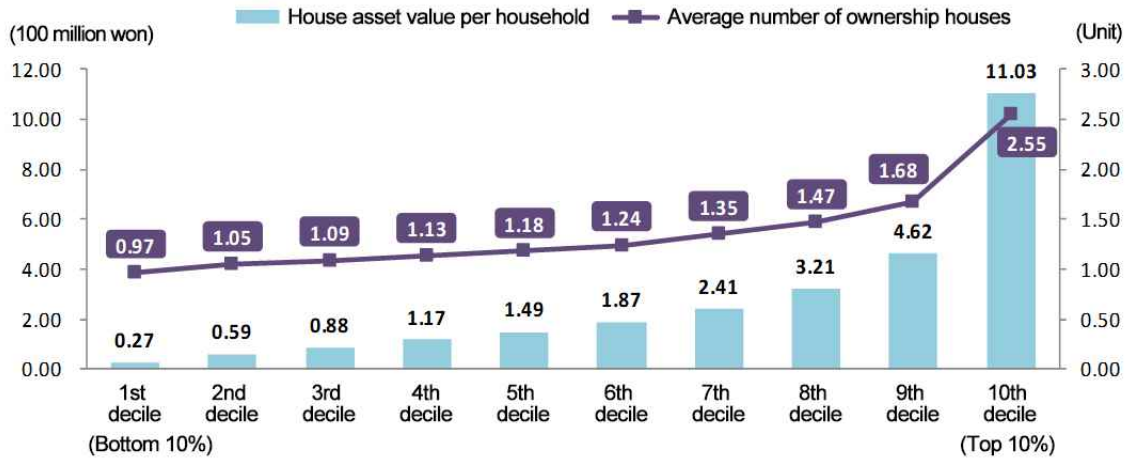


※ The figures in parentheses represent the year-on-year change in the house ownership household ratio (%p).

- As for house ownership by decile of house asset value, the higher decile, the higher average number of houses.
- The average house asset value of the 10th decile (top 10%) recorded 1.103 billion won. The average number of houses of the 10th decile recorded 2.55 units. The average house asset value of the 1st decile (bottom 10%) recorded 27 million won. The average number of houses of the 1st decile recorded 0.97 unit.

* House asset value was calculated by applying the published house price as of January 1, 2020. In the case of co-ownership, ownership shares were reflected for the calculation.

<House asset value by decile>

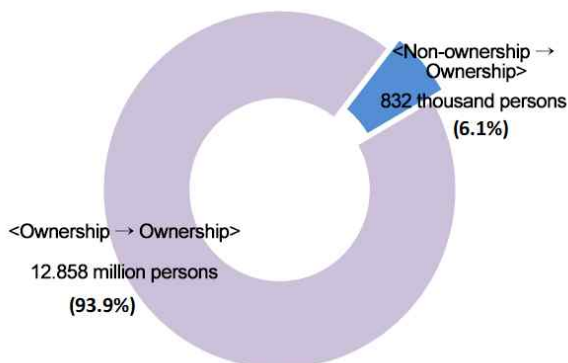


4. Longitudinal profile analysis for the 2018 to 2019 period

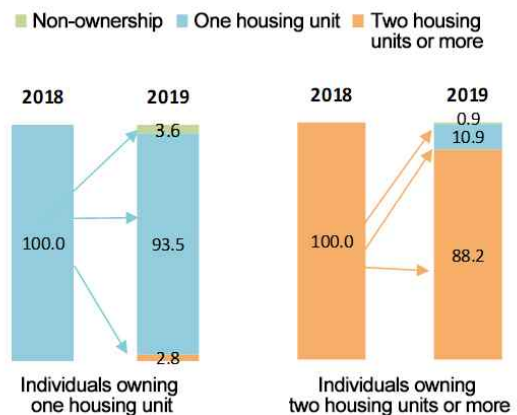
※ Longitudinal profile analysis covered all people living in Korea in 2018 and 2019. New born babies, the deceased and people migrating to foreign countries were excluded from the calculation.

- Individuals recording a year-on-year increase in the number of ownership houses recorded 1.238 million persons. Individuals recording a year-on-year decrease in the number of ownership houses recorded 744 thousand persons.
- Individuals whose status changed from non-ownership to ownership totaled 832 thousand persons. Individuals whose status changed from ownership to non-ownership totaled 424 thousand persons.
- Individuals whose status changed from 'Ownership of one housing unit' to 'Ownership of two housing units or more' marked 315 thousand persons (2.8%). Individuals whose status changed from 'Ownership of two housing units or more' to 'Ownership of one housing unit' marked 233 thousand persons (10.9%).

※ Statistics of individual ownership exclude foreigner ownership houses. Whereas, statistics of household ownership include ownership of foreigners (residing with Koreans) who belong to general households.
