



Vital Statistics of Immigrants in 2017

In 2017, the marriages of immigrants totaled 21,917 cases, which increased by 1.0% (208 cases) from 2016.

- The marriages of immigrants occupied 8.3% of the total marriages in 2017, increasing by 0.6%p from 2016.
- The marriages of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' occupied the largest share (65.0%) of the total marriages of immigrants. This figure was followed by 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' (19.6%) and 'naturalized Koreans' (15.4%).
 - Compared to 2016, the marriages of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' dropped by 0.1%. In the meantime, the marriages of 'naturalized Koreans' increased by 4.0%.
- As for marriages of foreign or naturalized wives by nationality, Vietnam occupied the largest share at 27.7%, which was followed by China (25.0%) and Thailand (4.7%).
 - Compared to 2016, the share of marriages of Vietnamese wives and Chinese wives fell by 0.2%p and 1.9%p. Whereas, the share of marriages of Thai wives grew by 1.4%p.
- As for marriages of immigrants by age gap, older husbands of 10 years or more occupied the largest share at 39.5%.

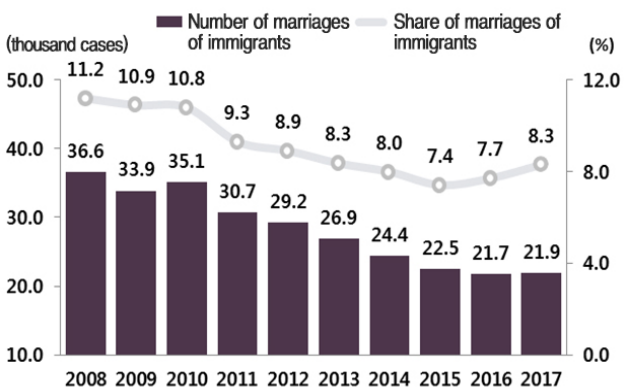
In 2017, the divorces of immigrants totaled 10,307 cases, down 3.0% (324 cases) from 2016.

- The divorces of immigrants occupied 9.7% of the total divorces in 2017, dropping by 0.2%p from 2016.
- The divorces of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' occupied the largest share (48.2%) of the total divorces of immigrants. This figure was followed by 'naturalized Koreans' (37.6%) and 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' (14.2%).
 - Compared to 2016, the divorces of 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' decreased by 7.8%. Compared to 2016, the divorces of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' decreased by 7.7%.
- As for divorces of foreign or naturalized wives by nationality, China occupied the largest share at 41.8%, which was followed by Vietnam (26.0%) and the Philippines (3.8%).
 - Compared to 2016, the share of divorces of Chinese wives fell by 2.7%p, while that of divorces of Vietnamese wives grew by 2.7%p.
- As for divorces of immigrants, the average duration of marriage recorded 7.8 years in 2017, increasing by 4.1 years compared to 2008.

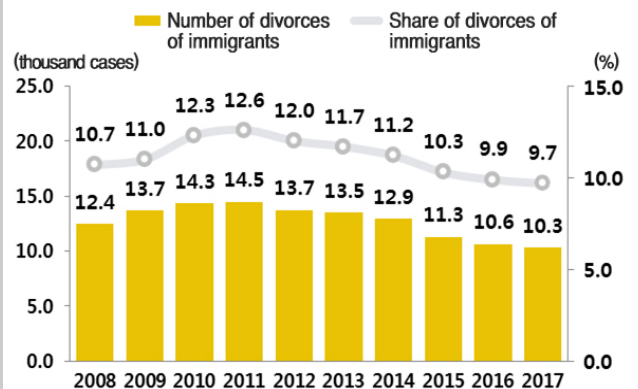
In 2017, the live births of immigrants totaled 18,440 persons, down 5.1% (991 persons) from 2016.

- The live births of immigrants occupied 5.2% of the total live births in 2017, up 0.4%p from 2016.
- The live births of 'Korean fathers and foreign mothers' occupied the largest share at 63.6% of the total live births of immigrants. This figure was followed by 'naturalized Koreans' (21.0%) and 'Korean mothers and foreign fathers' (15.5%).
 - Compared to 2016, the live births of 'Korean fathers and foreign mothers', 'Korean mothers and foreign fathers' and 'naturalized parents' declined by 5.9%, 6.2% and 1.7%, respectively.
- As for live births of foreign mothers by nationality, Vietnam occupied the highest share at 34.7%, which was followed by China (22.0%) and the Philippines (7.3%).
- The average age of immigrant mothers at birth marked 30.2 years in 2017, rising by 2.5 years from 2008.

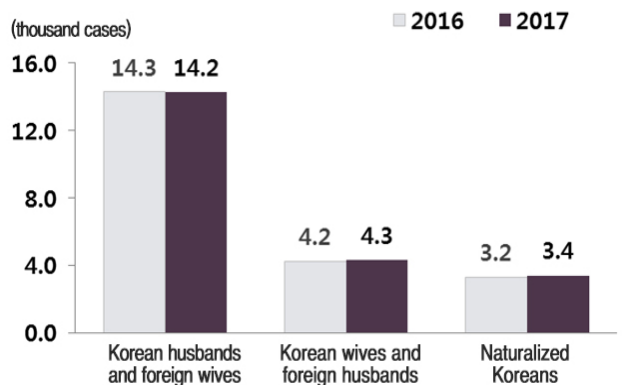

Trends in marriages of immigrants (2008-2017)



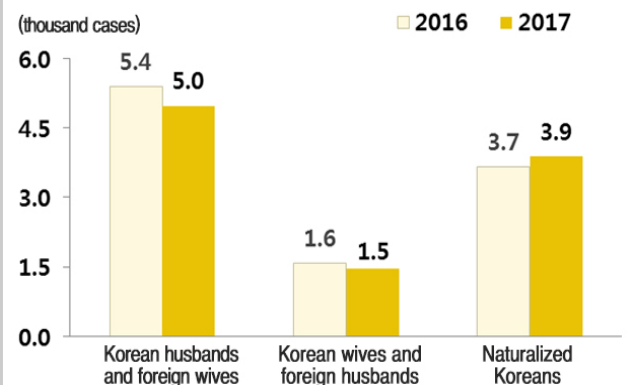
[Divorces of immigrants]

Number of marriages of immigrants by type (2016-2017)



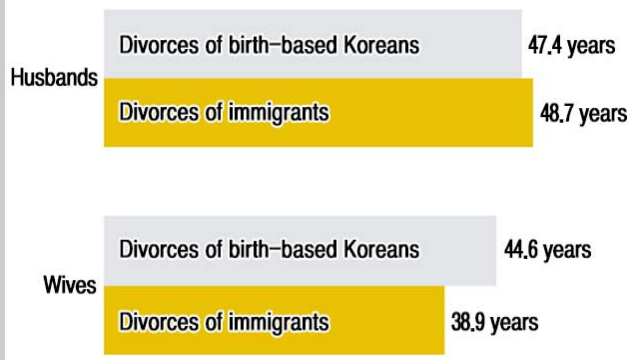
Number of divorces of immigrants by type (2016-2017)



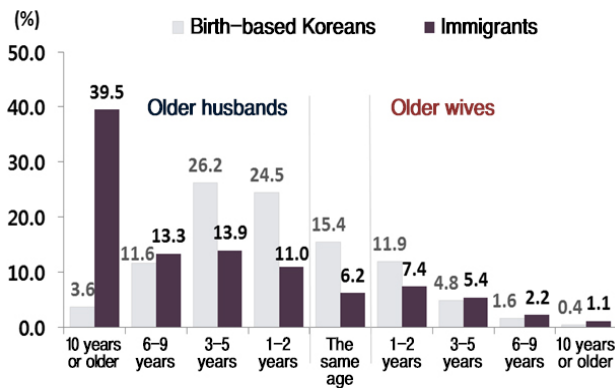
Average age at first marriage (2017)



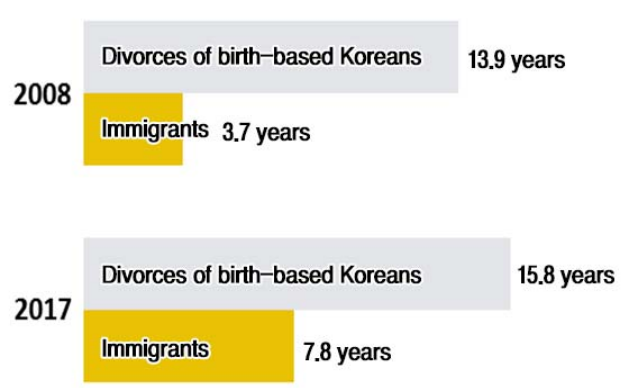
Average age at divorce (2017)



Share of marriages by age gap between husbands and wives (2017)

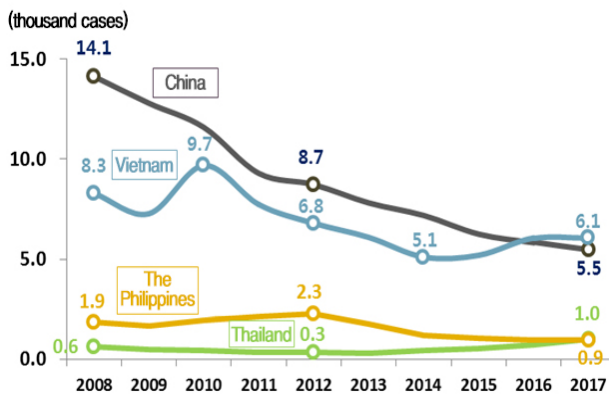


Average duration of marriage until divorce (2008, 2017)

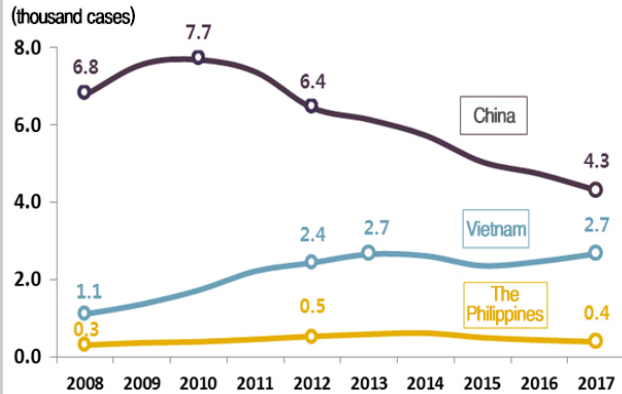


* Marriages (or divorces) of birth-based Koreans: Couples of husbands and wives who are both Koreans on the basis of birth

Trends in marriages by major nationality of wives (2008-2017)

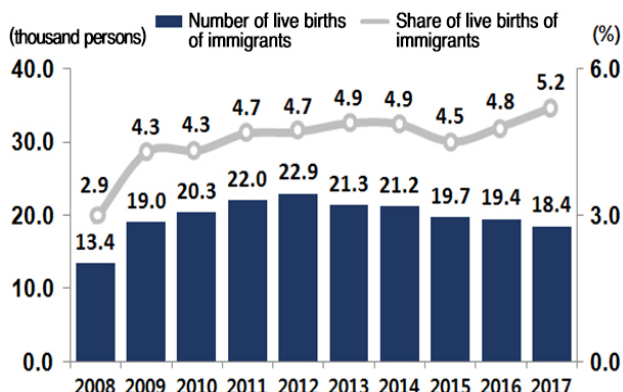


Trends in divorces by major nationality of wives (2008-2017)

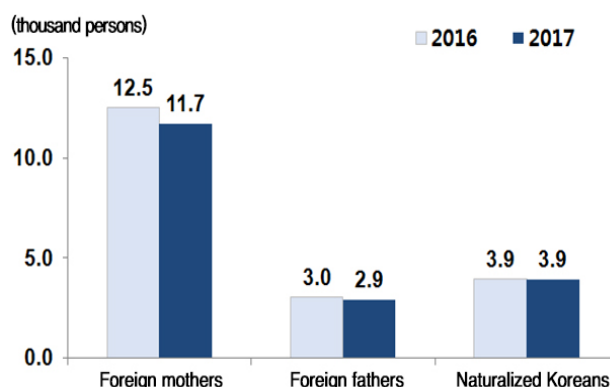

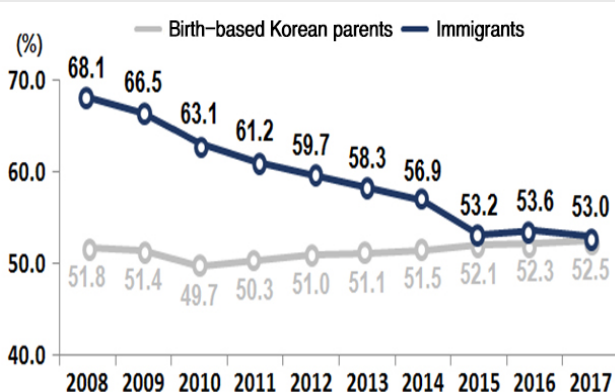
Trends in live births of immigrants (2008-2017)



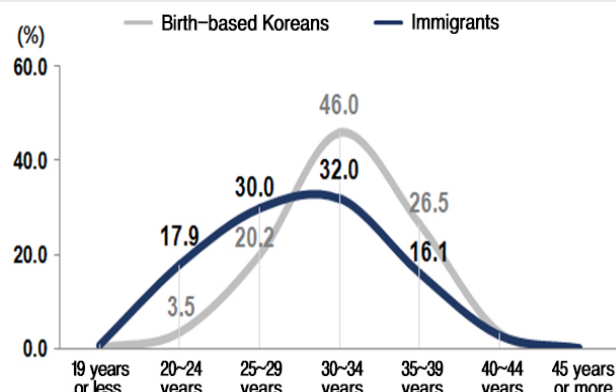
Number of live births by type (2016-2017)



Share of live births of the first child (2008-2017)



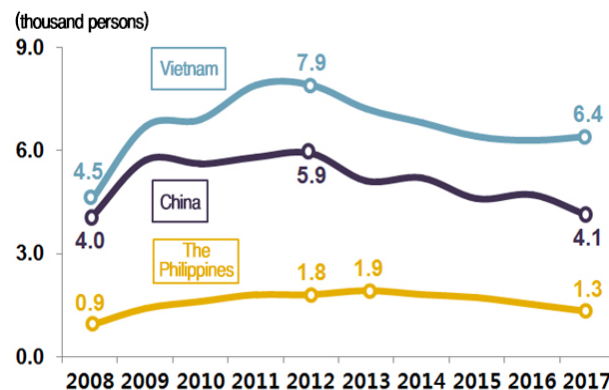
Share of live births by age of mothers (2017)
