Internal Migration in November 2022


- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 476 thousand persons in November 2022, which fell by 16.0% year-on-year.
 - In November 2022, the internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 11.3%, which declined by 2.1%p year-on-year.

1. Internal migration

- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 476 thousand persons in November 2022, falling by 16.0% (91 thousand persons) year-on-year.
- ☐ The intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants accounted for 66.2% and 33.8% of the total internal migrants in November 2022, respectively.


- O Compared to November 2021, the intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants fell by 18.0% and 11.8%, respectively.
- ☐ The internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 11.3%, down 2.1%p year-on-year.

2. Internal migration for metropolitan cities and provinces

□ Regarding the net migration of metropolitan cities and provinces, 9 regions recorded a plus net migration.: Gyeonggi (3,842 persons), Incheon (2,635 persons), Chungnam (1,769 persons), etc. On the other hand, 8 regions recorded a minus net migration.: Seoul (-6,405 persons), Busan (-1,026 persons), Daegu (-667 persons) and so on.

□ Sejong, Incheon and Chungnam recorded a plus net migration rate of 1.2%, 1.1% and 1.0%, respectively. On the other hand, Seoul, Gwangju and Busan recorded a minus net migration rate of -0.8%, -0.4% and -0.4%, respectively.
