

Internal Migration in February 2023


- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 622 thousand persons in February 2023, which fell by 6.3% year-on-year.
 - In February 2023, the internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 15.9%, which went down by 1.0%p year-on-year.

1. Internal migration

- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 622 thousand persons in February 2023, falling by 6.3% (42 thousand persons) year-on-year.
- ☐ The intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants accounted for 59.6% and 40.4% of the total internal migrants in February 2023, respectively.


- O Compared to February 2022, the intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants fell by 8.9% and 2.1%, respectively.
- ☐ The internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 15.9%, down 1.0%p year-on-year.

2. Internal migration for metropolitan cities and provinces

□ Regarding the net migration of metropolitan cities and provinces, 7 regions recorded a plus net migration.: Gyeonggi (4,738 persons), Seoul (3,467 persons), Incheon (2,569 persons), etc. On the other hand, 10 regions recorded a minus net migration.: Gyeongnam (-4,162 persons), Gyeongbuk (-2,015 persons), Daegu (-1,701 persons) and so on.

^{**} Monthly migration rates are converted by using annualized migration rates.

□ Sejong, Incheon and Chungnam recorded a plus net migration rate of 2.1%, 1.1% and 0.9%, respectively. On the other hand, Gyeongnam, Ulsan and Gyeongbuk recorded a minus net migration rate of -1.7%, -1.6% and -1.0%, respectively.
