In April 2023, the internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 10.8%, which went down by 0.6%p year-on-year.



1. Internal migration

- ☐ The number of internal migrants was 455 thousand persons in April 2023, falling by 5.6% (27 thousand persons) year-on-year.
- ☐ The intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants accounted for 65.5% and 34.5% of the total internal migrants in April 2023, respectively.
 - O Compared to April 2022, the intra-province migrants and the inter-province migrants dropped by 5.8% and 5.2%, respectively.
- ☐ The internal migration rate (the number of migrants per 100 population) stood at 10.8%, down 0.6%p year-on-year.

2. Internal migration for metropolitan cities and provinces

- ☐ Regarding the net migration of metropolitan cities and provinces, 9 regions recorded a plus net migration.: Gyeonggi (3,960 persons), Incheon (2,038 persons), Chungnam (1,277 persons), etc. On the other hand, 8 regions recorded a minus net migration.: Seoul (-3,365 persons), Busan (-1,392 persons), Gyeongnam (-996 persons) and so on.
- ☐ Incheon, Chungnam and Sejong recorded a plus net migration rate of 0.8%, 0.7% and 0.4%, respectively. On the other hand, Ulsan, Gwangiu and Busan recorded a minus net migration rate of -0.7%, -0.6% and -0.5%, respectively.
