
## 2013 Life Tables for Korea

The life expectancy at birth stood at 81.9 years in 2013, which went up by 0.5 year from 2012. The life expectancy at birth for males and females marked 78.5 years and 85.1 years, respectively.

- The life expectancy at birth for males recorded 78.5 years in 2013, which went up by 0.6 year from 2012 and by 4.7 years from 2003. The life expectancy at birth for females recorded 85.1 years in 2013, which went up by 0.4 year from 2012 and by 4.2 years from 2003.
- The life expectancy at birth for females was 6.5 years longer than that for males.
  - After recording a peak (8.4 years) in 1985, the difference in the life expectancy between the two genders showed a downward trend. In 2013, the difference marked the lowest figure after 1970.


## In 2013, the probability of dying from malignant neoplasms and pneumonia showed a rise for males and females compared to 2012.

- As for males, the probability of dying from malignant neoplasms, pneumonia and suicides went up by 0.5%p, 0.2%p and 0.1%p, respectively.
- As for females, the probability of dying from pneumonia, malignant neoplasms, and cerebrovascular diseases went up by 0.4%p, 0.3%p and 0.1%p, respectively.

In 2013, the life expectancy at birth of Korean males was 1.0 year higher than the average of OECD member countries. The life expectancy of Korean females was 2.2 years higher than the average of OECD member countries.

- In 2013, the life expectancy at birth of Korean males was 1.0 year higher than the average of OECD member countries (77.6 years). The life expectancy at birth of Korean females was 2.2 years higher than the average of OECD member countries (82.8 years).
- The difference in the life expectancy between the two genders for Korea (6.5 years) was higher than the average of OECD member countries (5.3 years).
