

Private Education Expenditures Survey of Elementary, Middle and High School Students in 2018

The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students marked 19.5 trillion won in 2018, which rose by 4.4% from 2017. The private education participation rate stood at 72.8% in 2018, up 1.7%p from 2017. The weekly participation hours recorded 6.2 hours per student in 2018, which grew by 0.1 hour from 2017.

- The total private education expenditures increased by 0.8 trillion won (4.4%) from 18.7 trillion won in 2017 to 19.5 trillion won in 2018.
- Compared to 2017, the total number of students recorded a decrease (2.5%), while the private education participation rate and the weekly participation hours recorded an increase.



The average monthly private education expenditures per student marked 291 thousand won in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student marked 399 thousand won in 2018.

- The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 291 thousand won in 2018, which rose by 19 thousand won (7.0%) from 272 thousand won in 2017.
 - The average monthly private education expenditures per elementary school student recorded 263 thousand won (3.7%↑, 10 thousand won). The average monthly private education expenditures per middle school student recorded 312 thousand won (7.1%↑, 21 thousand won). The average monthly private education expenditures per high school student recorded 321 thousand won (12.8%↑, 36 thousand won).
- The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 399 thousand won in 2018, which rose by 17 thousand won (4.6%) from 382 thousand won in 2017.


[Average monthly private education expenditures per student]

The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 213 thousand won per student in 2018, up 7.6% from 2017. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 398 thousand won per participation student in 2018, up 5.1% from 2017.

- The average monthly private education expenditures per student on Korean increased by 2 thousand won (12.9%) to 21 thousand won in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures per student on English increased by 6 thousand won (7.2%) to 85 thousand won in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures per student on mathematics increased by 4 thousand won (5.5%) to 83 thousand won in 2018.
- The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student on Korean increased by 7 thousand won (7.7%) to 104 thousand won in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student on English increased by 8 thousand won (4.2%) to 207 thousand won in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student on mathematics increased by 6 thousand won (3.3%) to 187 thousand won in 2018.



As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of students spending 700 thousand won or more showed the highest increase $(1.6\%p\uparrow)$, which was followed by those spending 600 thousand won ~ less than 700 thousand won $(0.6\%p\uparrow)$.


As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of students spending 400 thousand won and over showed a year-on-year increase. Whereas, the share of students spending 'Less than 100 thousand won', '200 thousand ~ less than 300 thousand won' and '300 thousand ~ less than 400 thousand won' showed a year-on-year decrease.



The higher household income level, the higher education expenditures and participation

- The average monthly expenditures for households earning 8 million won and over marked the highest figure of 505 thousand won per student. The average monthly expenditures for households earning less than 2 million won marked 99 thousand won per student.
- The participation rate of households earning 8 million won and over marked the highest figure at 84.0%. The participation rate of households earning less than 2 million won marked the lowest figure at 47.3%.


[Average monthly private education expenditures per student and private education participation rate by household income]


- The average monthly expenditures of 'Dual income households' recorded the highest figure of 307 thousand won per student, which was followed by 'Single income households by fathers' (297 thousand won) and 'Single income households by mothers' (185 thousand won).
- The average monthly expenditures of households with 1 child showed the highest figure of 324 thousand won per student, which was followed by households with 2 children (308 thousand won) and households with 3 children or more (225 thousand won).

[Average monthly private education expenditures per [Average monthly private education expenditures student by parents' economic activity] by number of children]




As for private education of general subjects by purpose, 'Preparation for higher school level', 'Study in advance' and 'Makeup for classes' showed an increase. As for private education of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of ability' and 'Preparation for higher school level' showed an increase.

- O As for purposes of general subjects, 'Makeup for classes' occupied the highest share at 49.0% (0.2%p↑), which was followed by 'Study in advance' (21.3%, 0.3%p↑) and 'Preparation for higher school level' (17.5%, 0.5%p↑).
- As for purposes of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of ability' occupied the highest share at 59.6% (1.0%p↑), which was followed by 'Child care and others' (12.5%, 0.6%p↓) and 'Preparation for higher school level' (10.0%, 0.2p↑).



The after-school program participation rate stood at 51.0%. The language course participation rate stood at 0.5%.

- The expenditures on paid and free after-school programs totaled 930 billion won, decreasing by 9.0% from 2017. The after-school program participation rate recorded 51.0%, down 3.7%p from 2017.
- The expenditures on language course totaled 480 billion won, increasing by 3 billion won (0.7%↑) from 2017. The language course participation rate recorded 0.5%, remaining the same as 2017.

1. Total private education expenditures

The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 19.5 trillion won in 2018.


- ☐ The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 19.5 trillion won in 2018, which grew by 4.4% from 18.7 trillion won in 2017.
- The private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students amounted to 8.6 trillion won, 5 trillion won and 5.9 trillion won in 2018, respectively.
- Compared to the previous year, the private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students grew by 5.2%, 3.5% and 3.9%, respectively.

The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 291 thousand won in 2018. The private education participation rate stood at 72.8% in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 399 thousand won in 2018.

- ☐ The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 291 thousand won in 2018, which rose by 19 thousand won (7.0%) from 272 thousand won in 2017.
- The average monthly expenditures per high school student marked the highest figure (321 thousand won), which was followed by middle school students (312 thousand won) and elementary school students (263 thousand won). The higher school level, the higher private education expenditures.
- Compared to 2017, the average monthly expenditures per elementary, middle and high school student increased by 3.7%, 7.1% and 12.8%, respectively.

- The average monthly expenditures per high school student recorded the highest figure of 549 thousand won, which was followed by middle school students (448 thousand won) and elementary school students (319 thousand won).
- Compared to 2017, the average monthly expenditures per elementary, middle and high school student grew by 3.9%, 3.7% and 7.7%, respectively.




< Private education participation rate >



3. Private education expenditures by subject

The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 213 thousand won per student in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 398 thousand won per participation student in 2018.

- ☐ The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects increased by 7.6% to 213 thousand won per student in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures on artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture increased by 5.8% to 76 thousand won per student in 2018.
- Ocompared to 2017, the private education expenditures of Korean, English, mathematics and 'Social studies and science' rose by 12.9%, 7.2%, 5.5% and 7.0%, respectively.
- ☐ The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects increased by 5.1% to 398 thousand won per participation student in 2018. The average monthly private education expenditures on artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture increased by 2.3% to 178 thousand won per participation student in 2018.
- Ocompared to 2017, the private education expenditures of Korean, English, mathematics and 'Social studies and science' rose by 7.7%, 4.2%, 3.3% and 7.0%, respectively.

4. Private education expenditures by type

As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures per student on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring', 'Group tutoring' and 'Textbooks with tutor's visit'. The average monthly expenditures per participation student on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring', 'Group tutoring' and 'Internet and correspondence lectures'.

- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 143 thousand won per student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (30 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (22 thousand won) and 'Textbooks with tutor's visit' (12 thousand won).
- Ocompared to 2017, the expenditures on 'One-on-one tutoring', 'Group tutoring', 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' and 'Textbooks with tutor's visit' grew by 7.3%, 4.0%, 7.9% and 4.1%, respectively.
- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 385 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (328 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (235 thousand won) and 'Textbooks with tutor's visit' (97 thousand won).

5. Average monthly private education expenditures by size

The share of students spending 700 thousand won and over per month on private education showed the highest increase of 1.6%p. The share of students spending 600 thousand won ~ less than 700 thousand won per month on private education went up by 0.6%p.

□ As for the average monthly private education expenditures, students spending 100 thousand ~ less than 200 thousand won occupied the highest share at 13.8%, which was followed by '200 thousand ~ less than 300 thousand won' (12.0%), '300 thousand ~ less than 400 thousand won' (9.9%) and '700 thousand won and over' (9.9%).
○ As for the average monthly private education expenditures by region, Seoul showed the highest share of students spending 700 thousand won and over. The other regions showed the highest share of students spending 100 thousand ~ less than 200 thousand won.
□ The share of students spending 700 thousand won or more showed the highest increase (1.6%p), which was followed by those spending 600 thousand won ~ less than 700 thousand won (0.6%p), those spending 400 thousand won ~ less than 500 thousand won (0.3%p)











☐ The average monthly expenditures of high school students recording 'Within top 10%' of school performance amounted to 384 thousand won, while those of students recording 'Within bottom 20%' of school performance amounted to 211 thousand won.

The participation rate of students recording 'Within top 10%' of school performance stood at 65.8%. In the meantime, the participation rate of students recording 'Within bottom 20%' of school performance stood at 47.4%.





which grew by 0.7% from 2017.




