

Private Education Expenditures Survey of Elementary, Middle and High School Students in 2021

The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 23.4 trillion won in 2021, which rose by 21.0% from 2020. The private education participation rate stood at 75.5% in 2021, up 8.4%p from 2020. The weekly participation hours marked 6.7 hours per student in 2021, which grew by 1.5 hours from 2020.

- The total private education expenditures grew by 4.1 trillion won (21.0%) from 19.4 trillion won in 2020 to 23.4 trillion won in 2021.
- Ocompared to 2020, the total number of students recorded a decrease. Whereas, the private education participation rate and the weekly participation hours recorded an increase.


The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 367 thousand won in 2021, rising by 21.5% from 2020. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 485 thousand won in 2021, rising by 8.0% from 2020.


○ (Total students)

The average monthly private education expenditures per elementary school student recorded 328 thousand won (93 thousand won, $39.4\%\uparrow$). The average monthly private education expenditures per middle school student recorded 392 thousand won (50 thousand won, $14.6\%\uparrow$). The average monthly private education expenditures per high school student recorded 419 thousand won (24 thousand won, $6.0\%\uparrow$).

O (Participation students)


The average monthly private education expenditures per elementary school participation student marked 400 thousand won (62 thousand won, $18.5\%\uparrow$). The average monthly private education expenditures per middle school participation student marked 535 thousand won (28 thousand won, $5.5\%\uparrow$). The average monthly private education expenditures per high school participation student marked 649 thousand won (7 thousand won, $1.0\%\uparrow$).






As for the average monthly private education expenditures of the total students by grade, 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 445 thousand won. As for the average monthly private education expenditures of the participation students by grade, 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 655 thousand won.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures of the total students by grade, 5th grade students in elementary school recorded the highest figure of 357 thousand won. 3rd grade students in middle school recorded the highest figure of 409 thousand won. 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 445 thousand won.
 - Compared to 2020, all grade students in elementary, middle and high school recorded an increase.
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures of the participation students by grade, 6th grade students in elementary school recorded the highest figure of 445 thousand won. 3rd grade students in middle school recorded the highest figure of 572 thousand won. 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 655 thousand won.
 - Compared to 2020, all grade students in elementary and middle school recorded an increase. As for high school, 1st and 2nd grade students recorded an increase, while 3rd grade students recorded a decrease.




[Average monthly private education expenditures per participation student by grade]



As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of students spending 700 thousand won or more went up by 3.0%p from 2020.

As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of students spending less than 200 thousand won showed a year-on-year decrease. Whereas, the share of students spending 200 thousand won or more showed a year-on-year increase.



The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 281 thousand won per student in 2021, rising by 17.6% from 2020. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 460 thousand won per participation student in 2021, rising by 1.4% from 2020.


As for the total students, the average monthly private education expenditures on English recorded the highest figure of 112 thousand won, which was followed by mathematics (105 thousand won) and Korean (30 thousand won).


- Compared to 2020, the average monthly private education expenditures on Korean (20.9%), English (19.7%), 'Social studies and science' (19.7%) and mathematics (12.8%) recorded an increase.

(Participation students)

As for the participation students, the average monthly private education expenditures on English recorded the highest figure of 225 thousand won, which was followed by mathematics (207 thousand won) and Korean (122 thousand won).


- Compared to 2020, the average monthly private education expenditures on 'Social studies and science' (-7.9%), Korean (-1.8%), mathematics (-1.7%) and English (-0.3%) recorded a decrease.






As for the private education of general subjects by purpose, 'Makeup for classes' and 'Study in advance' showed a year-on-year increase. As for the private education of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' and 'To make friends' showed a year-on-year increase.


- As for the purposes of general subjects, 'Makeup for classes' occupied the highest share at 50.5%, which was followed by 'Study in advance' (23.8%) and 'Preparation for higher school level' (14.2%). Compared to 2020, 'Makeup for classes' and 'Study in advance' recorded an increase. Whereas, 'Preparation for higher school level' recorded a decrease.
- As for the purposes of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' occupied the highest share at 61.9%. Compared to 2020, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' and 'To make friends' recorded an increase. Whereas, 'Child care, etc.' and 'Preparation for higher school level' recorded a decrease.






The higher household income level, the higher education expenditures and the participation rate.

- As for the average monthly expenditures, the households earning 8 million won or more recorded the highest figure of 593 thousand won per student. Whereas, the households earning less than 2 million won recorded 116 thousand won per student.
- As for the participation rate, the households earning 8 million won or more recorded the highest figure at 86.0%. Whereas, the households earning less than 2 million won recorded the lowest figure at 46.6%.





The after-school program participation rate stood at 28.9%. The language course participation rate stood at 0.1%.

The expenditures on paid and free after-school programs amounted to 440 billion won, decreasing by 52.1% from 2019. The paid and free after-school program participation rate recorded 28.9%, down 19.6%p from 2019.

The expenditures on language courses totaled 10 billion won, decreasing by 91.7% from 2020. The language course participation rate recorded 0.1%, down 0.4%p from 2020.

I. Results of the Private Education Expenditures Survey of Elementary, Middle and High School Students in 2021

1. Total private education expenditures


The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 23.4 trillion won in 2021, rising by 21.0% from 2020.


- In 2021, the private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students amounted to 10.5 trillion won, 6.3 trillion won and 6.5 trillion won, respectively.
 - Compared to 2020, the private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students grew by 38.3%, 17.7% and 3.0%, respectively.

2. Private education participation rate and weekly participation hours

The private education participation rate of elementary, middle and high school students stood at 75.5% in 2021, up 8.4%p from 2020. The weekly participation hours recorded 6.7 hours per student in 2021, which grew by 1.5 hours from 2020.

- The participation rate of elementary school students recorded the highest figure at 82.0%, which was followed by middle school students (73.1%) and high school students (64.6%).
 - Compared to 2020, the participation rate of elementary, middle and high school students went up by 12.3%p, 5.9%p and 3.0%p, respectively.

- The weekly participation hours of middle school students recorded the highest figure of 7.0 hours, which was followed by elementary school students (6.8 hours) and high school students (6.3 hours).
 - Compared to 2020, the weekly participation hours of elementary, middle and high school students went up by 2.2 hours, 1.0 hour and 0.4 hour, respectively.




Figure 4> [Private education participation hours per week by school level]

- As for the private education participation rate by grade, 3rd grade students in elementary school recorded the highest figure of 85.8%. 1st grade students in middle school recorded the highest figure of 74.1%. 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 68.0%.
 - Compared to 2020, all grade students in elementary, middle and high school recorded an increase in the participation rate.

3. Average monthly private education expenditures per student


The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 367 thousand won in 2021, rising by 21.5% from 2020. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 485 thousand won in 2021, rising by 8.0% from 2020.

- The average monthly expenditures recorded 419 thousand won per high school student, 392 thousand won per middle school student and 328 thousand won per elementary school student. Compared to 2020, the average monthly expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students went up by 39.4%, 14.6% and 6.0%, respectively.
- The average monthly expenditures recorded 649 thousand won per high school participation student, 535 thousand won per middle school participation student and 400 thousand won per elementary school participation student. Compared to 2020, the average monthly expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students went up by 18.5%, 5.5% and 1.0%, respectively.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures of the total students by grade, 5th grade students in elementary school recorded the highest figure of 357 thousand won. 3rd grade students in middle school recorded the highest figure of 409 thousand won. 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 445 thousand won.
 - Compared to 2020, all grade students in elementary, middle and high school recorded an increase in the average monthly private education expenditures.
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures of the participation students by grade, 6th grade students in elementary school recorded the highest figure of 445 thousand won. 3rd grade students in middle school recorded the highest figure of 572 thousand won. 1st grade students in high school recorded the highest figure of 655 thousand won.
 - Compared to 2020, all grade participation students in elementary and middle school recorded an increase in the average monthly private education expenditures. As for high school, 1st and 2nd grade participation students recorded an increase, while 3rd grade participation students recorded a decrease.

4. Average monthly private education expenditures by size

The share of students spending 700 thousand won or more per month on private education went up by 3.0%p from 2020.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of student groups spending less than 200 thousand won showed a year-on-year decrease. Whereas, the share of student groups spending 200 thousand won or more showed a year-on-year increase.
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures by area, Seoul, metropolitan cities and cities showed the highest share of students spending 700 thousand won and over. 'Eup & Myeon' showed the highest share of students spending 100 thousand won ~ less than 200 thousand won.



5. Average monthly private education expenditures by subject

The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 281 thousand won per student in 2021, going up by 17.6% from 2020. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 460 thousand won per participation student in 2021, rising by 1.4% from 2020.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects, English recorded the highest figure of 112 thousand won per student, which was followed by mathematics (105 thousand won), Korean (30 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (16 thousand won).
 - As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects by grade, 5th grade students in elementary school spent the largest expenditures on English (117 thousand won). 3rd grade students in middle school spent the largest expenditures on mathematics (163 thousand won). 1st grade students in high school spent the largest expenditures on mathematics (171 thousand won).
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects, English recorded the highest figure of 225 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by mathematics (207 thousand won), Korean (122 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (116 thousand won).
 - As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects by grade, 6th grade participation students in elementary school spent the largest expenditures on English (205 thousand won). 3rd grade participation students in middle school spent the largest expenditures on mathematics (270 thousand won). 3rd grade participation students in high school spent the largest expenditures on mathematics (338 thousand won).



6. Average monthly private education expenditures per student by type

As for the private education expenditures on general subjects and 'Artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture' of the total students, 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure. As for the private education expenditures on general subjects of participation students, 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure. As for the private education expenditures on 'Artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture' of participation students, 'One-on-one tutoring' recorded the highest figure.

- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 195 thousand won per student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (38 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (24 thousand won) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (13 thousand won).
- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 438 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (374 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (262 thousand won) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (126 thousand won).

7. Private education by purpose

As for the private education of general subjects by purpose, 'Makeup for classes' and 'Study in advance' showed a year-on-year increase. As for the private education of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' and 'To make friends' showed a year-on-year increase.

- As for the private education of general subjects by purpose, the share of 'Makeup for classes' and 'Study in advance' went up by 0.5%p and 0.1%p, respectively. The share of 'Preparation for higher school level' and 'Child care, anxiety, making friends, etc.' went down by 0.4%p and 0.2%p, respectively.
 - As for elementary and middle school students, 'Makeup for classes' and 'Study in advance' were major purposes of private education. As for high school students, 'Makeup for classes' and 'Preparation for higher school level' were major purposes of private education.




