Private Education Expenditures Survey of Elementary, Middle and High School Students in 2022

The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 26 trillion won in 2022, which rose by 10.8% from 2021. The private education participation rate stood at 78.3% in 2022, up 2.8%p from 2021. The weekly participation hours marked 7.2 hours per student in 2022, which grew by 0.5 hours from 2021.

- The total private education expenditures grew by 2.5 trillion won (10.8%) from 23.4 trillion won in 2021 to 26 trillion won in 2022.
- Compared to 2021, the total number of students recorded a decrease. Whereas, the private education participation rate and the weekly participation hours recorded an increase.





 - Compared to 2021, all grade students in elementary, middle and high school recorded an increase in the average monthly private education expenditures per participation student.




[Average monthly private education expenditures per student by grade] Init: 10 thousand won) **2021 2022**






As for the private education of general subjects by purpose, 'Study in advance' and 'Preparation for higher school level' showed a year-on-year increase. Whereas, 'Makeup for classes' showed a year-on-year decrease. As for the private education of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' and 'Child care, etc.' showed a year-on-year increase.

- As for the purposes of general subjects, 'Makeup for classes' occupied the highest share at 50.0%, which was followed by 'Study in advance' (24.1%) and 'Preparation for higher school level' (14.2%). Compared to 2021, 'Study in advance', 'Preparation for higher school level' and 'Child care, etc.' recorded an increase. Whereas, 'Makeup for classes' recorded a decrease.
- As for the purposes of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' occupied the highest share at 63.4%. Compared to 2021, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' and 'Child care, etc.' recorded an increase. Whereas, 'Makeup for classes', 'To make friends' and 'Preparation for higher school level' recorded a decrease.



The higher household income level, the higher education expenditures and the participation rate.

- As for the average monthly expenditures, the households earning 8 million won or more recorded the highest figure of 648 thousand won per student. Whereas, the households earning less than 3 million won recorded 178 thousand won per student.
- As for the participation rate, the households earning 8 million won or more recorded the highest figure at 88.1%. Whereas, the households earning less than 3 million won recorded the lowest figure at 57.2%.


I. Results of the Private Education Expenditures Survey of Elementary, Middle and High School Students in 2022

1. Total private education expenditures

The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 26 trillion won in 2022, rising by 10.8% from 2021.

- In 2022, the private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students amounted to 11.9 trillion won, 7.1 trillion won and 7 trillion won, respectively.
 - Compared to 2021, the private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students grew by 13.1%, 11.6% and 6.5%, respectively.

The private education participation rate of elementary, middle and high school students stood at 78.3% in 2022, up 2.8%p from 2021. The weekly participation hours recorded 7.2 hours per student in 2022, which grew by 0.5 hours from 2021.




The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 410 thousand won in 2022, rising by 11.8% from 2021. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 524 thousand won in 2022, rising by 7.9% from 2021.

- O The average monthly private education expenditures recorded 460 thousand won per high school student, 438 thousand won per middle school student and 372 thousand won per elementary school student. Compared to 2021, the average monthly expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students went up by 13.4%, 11.8% and 9.7%, respectively.
- O The average monthly private education expenditures recorded 697 thousand won per high school participation student, 575 thousand won per middle school participation student and 437 thousand won per elementary school participation student. Compared to 2021, the average monthly expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students went up by 9.2%, 7.4% and 7.3%, respectively.

The share of students spending 700 thousand won or more per month on private education went up by 3.3%p from 2021.



5. Average monthly private education expenditures per student by subject

The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 310 thousand won per student in 2022, going up by 10.2% from 2021. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 490 thousand won per participation student in 2022, rising by 6.5% from 2021.

- O As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects, English recorded the highest figure of 123 thousand won per student, which was followed by mathematics (116 thousand won), Korean (34 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (18 thousand won).
 - As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects by grade, 6th grade students in elementary school spent the highest expenditures on English (136 thousand won). 3rd grade students in middle school spent the highest expenditures on mathematics (171 thousand won). 1st grade students in high school spent the highest expenditures on mathematics (184 thousand won).
- O As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects, English recorded the highest figure of 236 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by mathematics (220 thousand won), Korean (137 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (128 thousand won).
 - As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects by grade, 6th grade participation students in elementary school spent the largest expenditures on English (221 thousand won). 3rd grade participation students in middle school spent the largest expenditures on mathematics (276 thousand won). 2nd grade participation students in high school spent the largest expenditures on mathematics (356 thousand won).



6. Average monthly private education expenditures per student by type

As for the private education expenditures on general subjects and 'Artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture' of the total students, 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure. As for the private education expenditures on general subjects of participation students, 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure. As for the private education expenditures on 'Artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture' of participation students, 'One-on-one tutoring' recorded the highest figure.

- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 221 thousand won per student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (39 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (23 thousand won) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (15 thousand won).
- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 462 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (393 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (277 thousand won) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (135 thousand won).


