




2020 Statistics of One-person Households


In 2019, one-person households occupied 30.2% of the total households.

- As for one-person households by age group, households with a member aged 20~29 occupied the largest share at 18.2% in 2019. This share was followed by those with a member aged 30~39 (16.8%), those with a member aged 50~59 (16.3%) and those with a member aged 60~69 (15.2%).
- Females aged 60 or more showed a higher share of one-person households than males in the same age groups. Males aged 30~59 showed a higher share of one-person households than females in the same age groups.

< Share of one-person households by gender and age group (2019) >



In 2019, one-person households residing in 'Monthly rent with deposit' occupied 38.0% of the total households.


- In 2019, as for the total households by housing occupancy type, 'Owned' took up the largest share at 58.0%, which was followed by 'Monthly rent with deposit' (19.7%) and 'Lease' (15.1%). In the meantime, as for one-person households by housing occupancy type, 'Monthly rent with deposit' took up the largest share at 38.0%, which was followed by 'Owned' (30.6%) and 'Lease' (15.8%).
- As for housing support programs to be desired by one-person households, 'Loans for housing lease' recorded the highest share at 29.9% in 2019, which was followed by 'Subsidy for monthly rent' (21.0%) and 'Long-term public rental housing supply' (16.7%).



In October 2019, one-person households with an employed member took up 60.8% of the total one-person households.


- In October 2019, one-person households with an employed member totaled 3.671 million households. As for one-person households with an employed member by age group, households with a member aged 50~64 occupied the largest share at 27.6%, which was followed by those with a member aged 30~39 (22.6%) and those with a member aged 40~49 (19.5%).
- As for the average weekly hours worked of one-person households, males and females recorded 42.7 hours and 37.2 hours, respectively, in October 2019. Both males and females showed a decrease in the average weekly hours worked.

< Average weekly hours worked of one-person households >



In 2018, the annual income of one-person households was 21.16 million won, which recorded 36.3% of the annual income of the total households.


- In 2018, the annual income of one-person households marked 21.16 million won, rising by 2.6% from 2017. This increase rate was 0.4%p higher than that of the total households. Nevertheless, the annual income of one-person households stood at 36.3% of the annual income of the total households.
- In 2019, the average monthly consumption expenditures of one-person households amounted to 1.426 million won. This figure recorded 58.0% of the average monthly consumption expenditures of the total households. Consumption expenditures on 'Housing, water, electricity and other fuels' (17.9%) occupied the largest share of the total consumption expenditures, which was followed by 'Restaurants and hotels' (16.0%).

< Average monthly consumption expenditures (2019) >





In 2019, 51.6% of one-person household members provided their own living expenses after retirement.

- In 2019, 47.7% of one-person households purchased ready-to-eat food products one time or more per week. This percentage was 7%p higher than that of the total households (40.7%).


- In 2019, the largest share of one-person household members (51.6%) provided their own living expenses after retirement. This share was followed by 'Government and social organizations' (27.7%) and 'Support from children or relatives' (20.8%).

< Provision of living expenses after retirement (Persons aged 60 or more) (2019) >



In 2019, the average daily leisure time of one-person households marked 4.2 hours, which was 1.2 times higher than that of the total population.


- As for leisure activities, in 2019, both one-person households and the total population spent their most time 'Watching TV', which was followed by 'Rest' and 'PC games and Internet surfing'.
- In 2019, the average daily leisure time of one-person households stood at 4.2 hours, rising by 0.4 hour from 2018. This figure was 1.2 times higher than that of the total population (3.5 hours).
